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Words from the Board President: Thomas V. Anderson

This last year has been a very busy but productive year for the Board. Our biggest achievement was the recodification of the honored to be 1987 Statutes. Several Boards over the past nine years, attempted this project 7 different times. During that time, the different Boards reached out, primarily to the surveying community, for guidance and acceptance of the proposed language which had a distinct impact on their profession. While the Board did not receive 100% acceptance from all surveyors, we did have a majority of the profession accepting the proposed changes.

After all the time and effort put into the current statutes, the Board believes all changes

benefit the licensees in Wyoming as well as the general public.

At the March meeting I was honored to be elected Board President. Dr. David Whitman left some really big shoes to fill. Dave has been an inspirational example in teaching and guiding the Wyoming Board to improve our service to the engineering and surveying communities and especially to the Wyoming Public. Thankfully, in early June, Dave's term was extended for another four years by Governor Mead. In addition, Corky Stetson, and I were reappointed to another 4 year term. One of the changes in the new statutes is that the membership of the Board will be increased by two members, an LS or PE/LS, and a PE. This will greatly aid in reviewing applications and performing complaint investigations. You will read about the two new appointees later in this edition of the Newsletter.

With the passing of the legislation, the work has just begun. The Board has completed the process of writing "Emergency Rules" to coordinate with the new statutes. The Emergency Rules have been posted on the Boards website and will be in effect until Final Rules can be adopted. Additionally, the proposed Final Rules are on the Boards website with a request for public comments. The comment period will last 45 days at which time the comments will be analyzed, and if necessary, the rules will be amended.

Change is coming in the examinations for FE and FS and will occur at the end of this year. Computer Based Testing (CBT) will commence in January 2014. A request to sit for either the FE or FS exam will be submitted directly to NCEES. After the examinee receives their test results, they can then apply to the state they wish their In-Training Certification with. The advantage of Computer Based Testing is that it will allow the examinee to test in any jurisdiction that has a Pearson Vue Testing Center. Therefore, if it is more convenient for an examinee to take the exam during their Holiday break for instance, they can do so, and do it in whatever jurisdiction they might be visiting. When that examinee needs certification of the test results, they can apply to any jurisdictional Board of their choosing to obtain their Certification. Of course, the examinee must meet the application requirements of the jurisdictional Board they are applying to. You can find information regarding the Computer Based Testing on the Boards website as well as at NCEES.org NCEES has planned that within the next few years, the PE and PS exams will be converted to CBT as well.

The Board has generated a colorful and informative brochure for the purposes of educating the state societies, public officials, county clerks and others on licensing requirements and proper signing and sealing of engineering and surveying plats, plans, specifications etc. The brochure will not be published until a strategic plan and mission statement can be adopted by the Board. The Board hopes to have the brochure completed and mass produced in the final months of 2013. In addition, the Boards Outreach efforts have proven successful with the creation of a Facebook Account, Twitter Account and an exciting downloadable Mobile Application.

I look forward to working with this Board, the two newest members of the Board, as well as the office staff. Please never hesitate to contact the Board office when you have questions arise. We are here to serve you and the public, and will do so promptly and professionally.

LS Education and Experience: Skyler V. Wilson, LS

A lot of us older surveyors acquired our licenses by way of apprenticeship. This option was eliminated on June 30, 1991. From that point on applicants were required to have formal education in land surveying, specifically a bachelor degree in surveying or engineering with 30 semester hours of approved land surveying courses, or an associate degree in land surveying plus 4 years of field experience.

Though we have tried in recent years to make a bachelor in surveying the minimum educational requirement, this effort has failed at the state legislature. The two main reasons are that some legislators would not support it, and more importantly, the Wyoming surveying community as a whole was not sufficiently supportive. This subject will need to be discussed another day.

Let's look at what Wyoming's higher schools have to offer in the way of surveying education. Sheridan College offers an AAS in surveying technology which meets the minimum 30 hours required by both statute and Board Rules. The University of Wyoming (UW) does not offer associate degrees, but they do have a program which offers a Certificate in Land Surveying. This program was originally intended to help the surveying applicant come close to meeting the educational requirements of the Board and statute, but its one drawback is that only 24 semester hours are required to qualify for the certificate. This was because UW didn't have all that many surveying classes to offer several years ago. That has changed. There are now over 50 hours of classes on tap for the surveying student.

When the Board recently asked UW to change the requirements for their certificate program from 24 hours to 30 hours, they expressed a willingness to do so. The problem then was to choose which courses should an applicant take, at minimum, to meet the statute and Rules requirement of "...a curriculum approved by the board..." It was agreed that I would work with UW's Director of Surveying Program, Mark Rehwaldt, to accomplish that task. Mark and I have been working for some months to that end. The problem is that with so many good classes now offered, it is hard to stop at just 30 hours.

After much discussion, with Mark, the Board, and the surveying community, we are getting pretty close. We have come up with a list of classes that we feel are the absolute minimum required to qualify. They are: CE 2050 Real Property Law (3), CE 2072 Engineering Surveying Lecture (2), ENTK 2500 CAD Sheridan College (3), CE 2089 Geodesy (2), CE 2088 Writing Legal Descriptions (2), CE3750 Evidence and Procedures for Boundary Location (2), CE 3740 Boundary Control and Legal Principles (2), CE 2085 Public Land Surveys (3), CE 3710 Route Surveying (3), and CE 2090 GPS for Land Surveyors(4). These courses total 26 hours. Obviously, we need four more hours.

Two classes that I would like to see added are: CE 2074 Ethics (1), and CE 3720 Advanced Surveying (4). This would bring the total to 31 hours. There are some who feel strongly that GIS should also be required. In fact, I've had long discussions with many of you regarding the importance of CAD, GPS, and GIS. As it now stands, CAD is somewhat required and GPS and GIS are optional. Some feel that GIS is the most important and CAD and GPS should be learned on the job. Others express surprise and shock that GPS isn't required. Based upon the majority of opinions I've heard, the ranking is: CAD, GPS, and GIS. That's what is reflected in the proposed course outline. CAD will be required. (It is unfortunate that UW doesn't offer any appropriate online CAD courses – you have to go through Sheridan College for that.) GPS will be required. GIS will be optional.

To give you just a taste of some of the classes we had to pass up: Advanced Public Lands, Photogrammetry, Records Research, Coastal Water Boundaries, Inland Water Boundaries, and Least Squares Adjustment. Some classes Mark is thinking about developing are: Applied Hydraulics & Hydrology, Machine Control, Subdivision Design, Advanced Boundaries, Wyoming Water Rights, and Projections and Cartography. (If we ever get a four-year degree requirement, you can see that UW will be well positioned to get a program in place.)

If you have strong opinions about courses that you think should be required, please let us know. We are close to finalizing the outline, but if we see there is an obvious consensus on certain classes, there is still time to make changes. Just remember: we really can't go much past 30 hours.

Since we have a little extra space in our newsletter, I'm going to talk a little bit about work experience. As you probably know, you need 4 years of acceptable experience to qualify for the LS. But did you know that we changed the work experience from 4 years to 2 years for the LSIT (if you are applying under the associate program)?

Let's discuss some of the things we like to see on the work experience form you send with your application. We expect you will all start out as rookies in the field. In the old days, that would mean brushman/axman or chainman or rodman or maybe note taker. These days it would probably just be a rodman. Then you'll move up to party chief with a little experience. Go ahead and put this time down, but what we really want to see is what *types* of surveys you performed. Some construction surveying is to be expected, so put it down, but remember that this doesn't make you a land surveyor. Well staking, pad staking, pipeline staking – all good, but we want to know if you know about boundary surveying.

Have you done any boundary surveys? Good! Put them down and describe them. Don't just put down "boundary surveys" – give us the details. (Not each project, just the type.) Were they metes and bounds? Lots in subdivisions? Subdivisions? Aliquot parts? Rights of way? Did you have to do any retracement, reestablishing lost corners? Do you have any PLSS experience? This is important. Wyoming has a lot of federal lands. Here in Sublette County it is about 80%. That means we bump up against BLM or USFS lands all the time. You need to know how to find section and quarter-section corners, how to reestablish them, how to break down a section, lots, fractional sections, meander corners, etc.

We also like to see that you have written legal descriptions, filled out corner records, have performed research (deed and easement research, GLO notes, State Engineer's Office, local utility companies, discussed fences with client and adjoiners, etc.), maybe worked on some water rights. HES and ALTA surveys are good. Control surveys and as-builts are okay. A little management will probably come your way as you gain in knowledge and experience. This is good, but we want to see that you have learned the field work before you transition to full-time office work. Speaking of office work, some of that is good too. Tell us a little about your CAD, GIS, computations, deed analysis, photogrammetry, etc., experience. You don't have to get too detailed here. A mapper isn't a surveyor.

I'll end with a final piece of advice. Be honest on your applications. We can tell when you are trying to shine us on. We may be willing to give you some leeway on your education worksheet if you are close. You'll need the full 30 hours, but if you are a little short in one category and one of your classes might work in another category, put it down. We might give you credit for it. The same goes on your experience record. Put down everything you think is important. But if you put down "GPS surveys" twenty-five times, we're not impressed. Your equipment is not what will make you a professional. It's your knowledge and experience. If you see that you are going into great detail about well locations, pipelines, topo, slope stakes, blue tops, parking lots, buildings, etc., this is probably a clue that you have too much construction surveying experience and not enough boundary experience. It will also be obvious to us. Make the effort to get as much boundary experience as you can. That's why we're licensed, and that's what we're looking for. Thank you.

Introducing Newly Appointed Board Member: Robert R. Norton, PELS

Effective July 1, 2013, Governor Matthew Mead appointed Robert R. Norton, PE/LS, Jackson to the Wyoming Board for Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors, and rightfully so. Norton's resume reveals 39 years of Professional Practice as a surveyor, resident engineer, design engineer, project engineer, and project manager. He has served as the president of Nelson Engineering for the last 18 years. He has extensive experience as project manager for large multi-disciplined projects for private, municipal, county, state and federal clients. The projects that he has managed have required facility planning, environmental assessments and clearances, securing land owner consents and easements, preliminary design, cost estimating, final design, construction contract administration and reporting, construction staking, inspection and testing.



Norton is a University of Wyoming graduate and holds his Professional license in many states. He served as President in 2006 to the Wyoming Engineering Society (WES), was the Rocky Mountain Regional Trustee for the American Water Works Association (AWWA) in 1995, was President of the Wyoming Association of Consulting Engineers and Surveyors (now ACEC of Wyoming) in 2001-2002 and is a part of the Water Environment Federation (WEF).

Some of the many projects for which Mr. Norton has been the project manager comprise of his work in Teton Village which included the replacing of an existing road that provided access to Teton Village from Wyoming State Highway 390, in 2013. The Teton Village Commons redevelopment, and the Teton Village Ranch Parking Lot and Maintenance Site in 2010. He was the project manager for the Expansion of the Teton Village Wastewater Treatment Plant from 2002-2010 which was a three-phase expansion. Project manager of the Teton Village Water Supply project in 1996 and Stormwater Facility in 1999.

In the town of Jackson Hole Wyoming, Norton has served as project manager to such projects as: the reconstruction of three blocks of a major collector street on East Kelly Avenue in 2001, the 1996 Snow King Avenue Street Rehabilitation Project with the reconstruction of an arterial street through the Rodeo Grounds. He was also project manager for the 1993 Gill Avenue/North Glenwood Street Improvement Project which included the first stormwater treatment facilities for Jackson's street runoff. The 1999 Gregory Lane Storm Drainage Improvements Project and the 1998 Rodeo Grounds Stormwater Filtration Project which included runoff from the rodeo grounds each year when snow plowed off the city streets and stored on the rodeo grounds melted, ran off the rodeo grounds site, and entered, untreated, into nearby Flat Creek.

He is also no stranger to permitting over the years. As project manager over The Wilson Sewer Project of 2006, he was required to get permitting easements from 112 private land owners and 14 local state and federal agencies, the project also included the design, permitting and construction of 17 miles of pipeline, Snake River crossing, and 7 lift stations.

Water projects dominate most of Norton's resume' with the Moose, Wyoming water system in Grand Teton National Park, the Fishing Bridge water system in Yellowstone National Park in 2013, the Teton Village Water Supply Enhancement and Storage Project in 2010 which included a 1.0 million gallon buried storage tank and SCADA system. Serving as project manager for the Town of Jackson Water Supply Project and the Development of Additional Water Supply for the Town of Jackson in 1986. His wastewater experience includes the City of Driggs, Idaho Wastewater Facilities Plan of 2007. Alpine Wastewater Treatment Plant Feasibility Study, Design and Construction and the Dubois Wastewater Treatment Plant from 2002-2007.

CBT- It all changes for the FE and FS Exams:

The Wyoming Board and NCEES are working together to help bring the FE and FS Exams closer to you.

Beginning November 1, 2013 all FE (Fundamental's of Engineering) Exams and FS (Fundamental's of Surveying) Exams move forward into a new era with Computer Based Testing!!

Where will I take my exam?

NCEES has partnered with *Pearson VUE*, a global leader in electronic testing, to provide computer-based delivery of the FE and FS exams. NCEES plans to begin offering computer-based FE and FS exams in January 2014 through Pearson VUE's network of professional centers and select locations. The FE and FS exams will definitely be offered at the professional centers (shown in blue). NCEES is currently working with Pearson VUE and the select locations (shown in purple) to determine which of them will offer the FE and FS exams.



How will I apply?

Wyoming is under an "Automatic" status for applicants. To apply, the applicant would first contact NCEES and get signed up for the exam under Wyoming. After the applicant has passed the exam they will contact the Wyoming Board and file the appropriate application, located on the website.
