SENATE AMENDMENTS TO H. B. No. 133.

In line 2, Section 1, printed bill, after the word "obliterate" strike out the comma and insert the word "or". In same line, same section, after the word "tear" insert "with malicious intent to".

AN ACT providing for protection of books, magazines, newspapers, periodicals and exhibits in libraries and museums, and providing penalty for violation <sup>of</sup> same.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

Section 1. Whoever shall mark, deface, obliterate, tear, destroy in whole or in part, any book, magazine, newspaper or periodical, or cut or remove therefrom any article, illustration or advertisements; or who shall break any case or injure, destroy in whole or in part any exhibit, in any reading room, library or museum shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, or imprisoned in the county jail not more than thirty days or by both fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

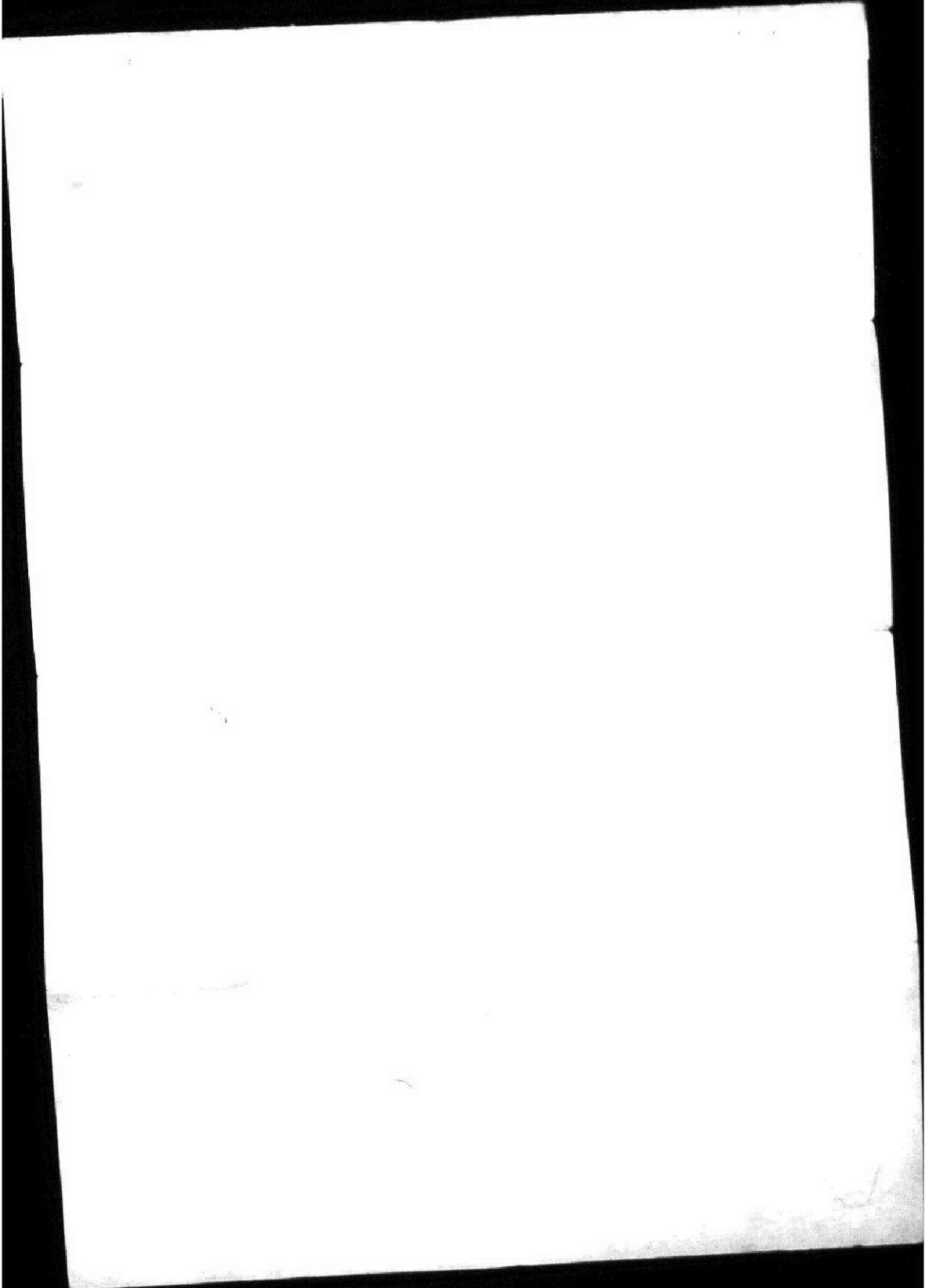
