# Are you on the lookout for tall whitetop?

Difficult to control noxious weed destroys ecosystems, steals pasture and rangeland. By John Spitler

he one thing you absolutely do not want to do with tall whitetop is ignore it. That's because it absolutely won't ignore you.

Among the world's most aggressive and destructive vegetative invaders, this woody member of the mustard family has stolen many of the American West's most precious waterways, meadows and rangelands.

Once established, always established. "Except for eliminating small, isolated patches, it's just not in the cards to completely rid infested areas," says biologist Jim Young of USDA's Agriculture Research Service (ARS) in Reno, Nev. Young, who has researched the weed for more than 10 years, says if established the emphasis becomes "... a suppression program rather than eradication program."

#### **NO SPACE IS SPARED**

Today, tall whitetop is being battled all over the West. Especially impacted are regions of Nevada, California, Colorado, Utah and Idaho.



Once home to groves of vigorous cottonwood and willow trees, today the banks along much of the Truckee River east of Reno, Nev., support only a useless thicket of tall whitetop.

"It's an international problem," says Young. "It's so adaptable. It's even a major problem in British Columbia and Northern Mexico." A native of Southeastern Europe and Southwestern Asia, tall whitetop may have hitchhiked to the Americas around 1900 in shipments of sugar beet seed. Regardless of how it got here, once it arrived and adapted it really got around.

Fields, riverbanks and valleys across the West now struggle against its infestation. Ranchers in the San Luis Valley in Colorado battle the weed. In Utah tall whitetop is found in a majority of the counties. "In some cases it's infected thousands and thousands of acres," says Steven Dewey, Utah State extension weed specialist.
