AN ACT providing for the issuance of fishing and hunting licenses to members of the armed forces of the United States stationed in Wyoming under the laws, rules and regulations of the Wyoming Game and Fish Commission; setting the amount of the license fee; and further providing a penalty for violation, and designating an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

Section 1. The Wyoming Game and Fish Commission is authorized to issue Military licenses permitting fishing and hunting of game animals, except elk, moose and mountain sheep, in certain areas and at certain times to be fixed and regulated by the Commission. Such licenses may be issued to any member of the armed forces of the United States who is not eligible for a resident license, and who has been on active duty in the State of Wyoming under competent orders for not less than thirty (30) days, provided that ninety (90) per cent of such licenses shall be issued to non-commissioned members of the armed forces.

Section 2. Each Military license shall be stamped or marked as such and shall designate the area in the state in which it is to be used and the time during which it shall be effective for a period of not more than ten (10) days; and not more than two hundred (200) Military licenses shall be in effect at the same time.

Section 3. Military licenses shall be non-resident licenses except as to fees paid, guides required, the number of licenses and their distribution. Each Military license shall be issued and used according to rules and regulations of the Commission now or hereafter made providing for such controls, restrictions, guides, safeguards and precautions as shall be necessary for

proper game conservation and for protection of persons and property.

Section 4. Military licenses, and use thereof, shall be subject to all laws of the State of Wyoming, and rules and regulations of the Commission, excepting any inconsistent with the specific provisions of the Act.

Section 5. It shall be unlawful for any holder of a Military license to hunt in any area other than that designated in his license, or at any time other than that designated in his license.

Section 6. Every person who shall receive any Military license shall pay a fee therefor as follows:

Military license for one deer only . . . \$5.00

Military license for one antelope only . \$5.00

(\$3.00 of which shall be paid by the Commission to the landowner upon whose land any antelope shall be killed according to the license as an administrative expense for feeding said antelope).

Military license for game fish only . . . \$1.50

Section 7. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Act *** shall, upon conviction, be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail for a period not to exceed six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 8. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after April 1, 1957.
