

The Project

Medicine Bow Fuel & Power LLC (MBFP) is developing a greenfield, mine-mouth Coal-to-Liquids (CTL) facility near Medicine Bow, Wyoming.

Current and planned assets include:

- · CTL Facility: To be developed, owned and operated by MBFP
- Coal Reserves: Current option to purchase approximately 180 million tons of bituminous coal from Arch Coal
- Coal Mine: Initially continuous mining operations
- Technology Licenses: Site license with General Electric (GE) to use their proprietary coal gasification technology
- Contracts for products from the facility
- · Surface land rights on property
- · Permits to construct and operate the coal mine and CTL facility

Ownership

MBFP is 100 percent owned by DKRW Advanced Fuels, LLC

Products

The CTL facility will produce the following (volumes are approximate):

- Up to 20,000 barrels per day of transportation fuel and associated energy products.
- Steam, tailgas and power produced from the CTL process will provide the necessary energy for internal CTL facility use with some surplus power sold to the utility grid.
- Other byproducts for sale in the market are elemental sulfur, chemicals, and slag, which will be put to productive use in the region.

Schedule

Construction is anticipated to start in the second quarter of 2008 with a 2012 in-service date.

Construction

MBFP will contract with SNC-Lavalin, an experienced and credit-worthy construction contractor, to construct, commission and test the CTL facility.

Operations

Arch Coal will operate and maintain the coal mine. MBFP or a subcontractor will operate and maintain the CTL facility.

Industrial Siting Permit Wyoming Public Meetings - July 2007 Questions and Answers

Carbon County Local Agencies Meeting Rawlins, Wyoming July 10, 2007 2:00 – 4:00 PM

- Q: Requested more detail on employees; when they will arrive, and information about transient (temporary) employees.
 - A: 2008 will peak at 400, 2009 up to 1200-1400, and 2010 up to 1800-2000. Looking at housing. Will try to pull staff from the community.
- Q: Are there any known obstacles to the project?
 - A: Process of permitting, financing, engineering and design. Very important to have acceptance at the local level. Need to have the right technical team. Well on the way in the permitting process.
- Q: Is this a hazardous operation?
 - A: As with any refinery there will be high pressure and flammable liquids. The right standards and precautions will be adhered to.
- Q: Are the coal operations included in the number of employees (2,000 construction and 300 operations):
 - A: Yes.
- Q: Where are we with the ISA application process?
 - A: Looking at jobs, transportation and housing both for Carbon County and other areas. We are drafting the report and looking for input. Should submit the report mid to late August with a November hearing.
- Q: How will emergency response be handled? Will you rely solely on local communities?
 - A: We will provide extensive emergency response training to locals who will benefit from this training. During construction, the project will have its own emergency response personnel.
- Q: Are there jobs descriptions for construction / operations jobs that locals can reference?
 - A: Yes, when we mobilize we will run ads listing training and certifications needed and conduct a job fair.

- Q: Is there a list of supplies and supporting services that will be needed so locals can respond and provide supplies and labor?
 - A: Yes, the list should be ready by the beginning of next year.
- Q: Please explain about community input after the socio economic report is submitted.
 - A: Explained the ISA process
- Q: Explain about the materials solid waste/ hazardous waste disposal:
 - A: Guard beds will capture and contain waste. We will comply with Federal Regulations regarding disposal. May be an opportunity to recycle and reuse as commercial products.
- Q: Is the federal government a player and if so how?
 - A: From an environmental side, EPA Region 8, the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), U.S. Fish & Wildlife, the Army Corp of Engineers, and others could be involved in the permit process but most of the permit applications and review process is done through the Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality.
- Q: How much of the plant will be subject to sales tax?
 - A: The Department of Revenue and DKRW will work together to provide numbers for a formula.
- Q: Impact assistance based on sales tax?
 - A: Growth is good in this energy sector, so money should be available.
- Q: Local governments need to determine where impacts are; not someone 200 miles away.
 - A: Yes, please provide information to CH2M HILL related to the local service and infrastructure surveys. Tom Schroeder of ISD is also available to meet with local agencies to discuss concerns.
- Q: Regarding sales tax and property tax, where's the delta for impact assistance?
 - A: Talk to your delegation.
- Q: Will there be more community meetings?
 - A: Yes, we will follow-up as needed per ISA requirements.

Carbon County Public Meeting Rawlins, Wyoming July 10, 2007 6:00 – 8:00 PM

- Q: This is said to be a 20-30 year project. What is the short term impact? What happens after that? Is there enough coal in Carbon County to run this project?
 - A: Financing is based on a 20-30 year supply of coal. A supply of 50-60 years is available from the Arch option.
- Q: What is the average day use of coal?
 - A: 8,000 tons per day (TPD)
- Q: How dedicated is Arch to the project?
 - A: Arch has signed the option. Arch likes the mine-mouth opportunity.
- Q: How does the coal get into the plant and how far is the coal from the facility?
 - A: There is a half-mile conveyor from the long-wall coal operation.
- Q: Do you have the capability to expand production (greater than the 13,000 BBD operation)?
 - A: Yes, it is possible based on the use of surface mine in addition to the underground mine resource
- Q: How far along are you on your financing?
 - A: Working on package to be submitted mid- 2008.
- Q: How new is the technology and where is it in operation?
 - A: Description provided of other operations around the world.
- Q: Is the water supply adequate?
 - A: Groundwater wells will provide 800 GPM. The Water Yield Analysis has been submitted to the State Engineer's Office for review. The facility will be zero discharge.
- Q: What are the other coal products?
 - A: Sulfur, slag, naphtha, and butanes/propanes
- Q: How is the liquid CO_2 transported away from the plant?
 - A: High pressure pipeline

- Q: What temperature is the liquid CO_2 that is transported away from the plant through pipes?
 - A: 100 deg F and 2,100 psi.
- Q: How much slag? What is the environmental impact of waste materials? What form is it? How will it react to wind? How will it impact livestock, etc.?
 - A: Approximately 400 tpd of slag will be produced. The material is very hard encapsulated material like bottom ash from a boiler. Fugitive emissions from the slag will be minimal. We are looking to sell the slag for reuse.
- Q: Where will the administrative office be located? Will there be any buildings in Medicine Bow, Hanna, etc.?
 - A: Warehouse will be located in Medicine Bow. An administrative facility will be located at project site.

Note: Industrial Siting Division Representative, Tom Schroeder (Program Principal) gave an overview of the ISA process, and addressed comments/questions.

State Agencies Meeting Cheyenne, Wyoming July 11, 2007 3:00 – 5:00 PM

- Q: What arrangements have been made for transmission of "excess" electricity; "saleable/export electricity" (export power)?
 - A: 80-120 MW of potential export. Talking with PacifiCorp.
- Q: What is the anticipated life of the coal reserves?
 - A: 50 to 60 years operation at 13,000 BPD Design.
- Q: Has water supply been studied?
 - A: Yes, Water Yield Analysis report has been submitted to State Engineer's Office for review. The facility will also utilize recycled process water and will be a zero discharge wastewater operation.
- Q: How large is the Fischer Tropsch reactor vessel?
 - A: About 14 to 23 feet in diameter.
- Q: Is there expansion ability?
 - A: Yes: Drivers are coal source and off-take agreements.

- Q: How viable is the Union Pacific siding at project Medicine Bow; status of working with Union Pacific on siding and spur
 - A: Good cooperation from Union Pacific; will continue work over next 18 months.
- Q: Where in the process is the product created from Fischer Tropsch?
 - A: In the upgrader/refinery process. Paraffin chain coming out of Fisher Tropsch; process separates naphtha/diesel.
- Q: What are the operating/ maintenance costs?
 - A: CTL is approximately \$25 million/year, not including coal or mine costs.
- Q: What's the breakeven for the production based on coal price?
 - A: Not relevant here. Managing cost due to relationship with ARCH Coal.
- Q: What is the minimal oil price to keep in the black?
 - A: Less than \$20 barrel.
- Q: Has Sinclair shown interest in or contracted for the naphtha?
 - A: No contract- We are investigating the best option.
- Q: What are the byproducts?
 - A: Sulfur, CO₂, slag, mercury, trace metals, acetic acid.
- Q: What is the expected plant availability?
 - A: 18 month start-up -low availability. By third year: 90% availability. Spare gasifiers would increase availability factor.
- Q: How much slag and CO_2 will you market and how much will be disposed of ?
 - A: At full operating capacity, approximately 700 tons/day of slag will be produced. Regarding CO₂, potential EOR (enhanced oil recovery) opportunities, sinks, facility benefits for capture.
- Q: What is the consistency of the slag?
 - A: It is a dry, granular-like material.
- Q: What about CO₂ takeoff?
 - A: The potential of a high pressure pipeline for EOR is under evaluation.
- Q: Why not a pilot facility first?
 - A: The coal to liquids technologies planned for this project are proven operating technologies at facilities around the world. There is no need to demonstrate at pilot scale.

- Q: Is the product going to be sold at a premium price because it's cleaner fuel?
 - A: It has value but the capital plan is based on the market diesel price.
- Q: What is the quality of the coal being used?
 - A: 11,700 Btu/lb western bituminous coal (not PRB).
- Q: Is the coal quality consistent throughout the mine?
 - A: Like any mine operation, there is a range of coal quality, however, the average is 11, 700 btu/lb.
- Q: What is the elevation of the site and will it affect the operation of the site?
 - A: 7,200 feet elevation- It derates equipment.

Albany County Local Agencies Meeting Laramie, Wyoming July 12, 2007 2:00 – 4:00 PM

- Q: Are there any synergies with the University School of Energy and also the Super Computer Project at Cheyenne?
 - A: Yes, possibly, to the extent that we can.
- Q: Will you need to ship out CO₂ or will Enhanced Oil Recovery (EOR) take it all?
 - A: EOR is good for older oil production fields. Wyoming has a lot of capacity to take CO₂.and there are other potential buyers.
- Q: How much coal reserves are available and how much coal will be used / needed daily?
 - A: 8,000 tons/day consumed, 300 million tons/year- Thus 50-60 years reserve, but we could also import coal.
- Q: How many gallons of fuel can be produced per ton of coal?
 - A: 1.5 barrels/ton of coal
- Q: What is the cleanup technology?
 - A: Selexol with polishing beds
- Q: What is needed from local communities/public sector to be successful and move forward?
 - A: Housing, employment, road infrastructure, CO₂ sale (EOR), energy regulations.

- Q: What role is the Department of Energy playing?
 - A: DOE is not playing a role. The DOE proves technology but this technology is already proven. This is a commercial project.
- Q: Will DKRW be able to help locate a grocery store, clinic, and gas station to Medicine Bow?
 - A: We will do what we can to encourage others to facilitate that. We won't be the drivers but will be working with state and local agencies and others.
- Q: Why here when other places have higher BTU coal?
 - A: Coal option. Coal is the lowest cost per ton, highest Btu per pound which means good economics.

- Geographic advantages: The project is located near refined pipelines- Sinclair. They can bring pipe to the site or use existing pipe.

- Natural gas is available.
- Rail & Transmission nearby. PacifiCorp has power lines nearby.
- Q: How much CO₂ will be produced?
 - A: About 120 million standard cubic feet per day or 7,000 tons per day.
- Q: Is capturing CO_2 the plan from the start?
 - A: Yes, the cleanup equipment is part of the design.
- Q: How deep is the coal mine?
 - A: Average 800 ft.
- Q: Ash is split out: How and then what?
 - A: Ash that comes out of the bottom of the gasifier is inert and non-hazardous. There is a potential market for reuse - asphalt shingles and road base.
- Q: Has this technology been used elsewhere?
 - A: Yes, by Sasol in South Africa. They have a 150,000 BPD facility. Gasification has been done in the USA, but the combined use of the technologies we are using will be the first in the United States.

Albany County Public Meeting Laramie, Wyoming July 12, 2007 6:00 – 8:00 PM

- Q: What is the breakeven cost?
 - A: Range of \$40 \$50 a barrel.
- Q: Looking at the partners and the proven technology. Who are the partners? What experience does Rentech have with Fisher Tropsch?
 - A: Rentech has experience from the 1990s with a facility in Denver. The issue is scale, but we think it's proven.
- Q: Is there an opportunity for the community to get on board to help with financing?
 - A: Probably not for individuals, as DKRW is private.
- Q: Do the 300 full time employees include the mine and CTL?
 - A: Yes, both.
- Q: How many employees are involved with employment in wind at Medicine Bow?
 - A: None now
- Q: Where are you going to draw your people? And what about housing workers in Carbon County versus Laramie? Laramie would benefit from management location in Laramie. Taxes are a concern.
 - A: The construction and operating workforce will be a mix of Wyoming and out of state personnel. Socioeconomic, workforce, housing and transportation issues are currently being evaluated. There will be a mix of temporary and permanent housing options looked at primarily in communities in Carbon County near the plant but options in Albany county are also being evaluated.
- Q: Could University of Wyoming graduates be enticed to come back or stay?
 - A: We are in partnership with the university through internship, training and alumni of chemical engineering.

Note: Industrial Siting Division Representative Tom Schroeder (Program Principal) gave an overview of the ISA process, and addressed comments/questions.
