Be it enacted by the Governor, that the following act be passed:

SECTION 1. There is hereby established the Board of State Supplies consisting of the Treasurer, Auditor and State Engineer. The members shall constitute a quorum.

SECTION 2. All supplies required by the State University, the State Normal School, or any executive or administrative office of the State, or any of nearly, except the State University and the State Library Commission, shall be furnished only in accordance to the terms of a written or verbal contract or contracts made by the Board of State Supplies and the person furnishing or offering the same. The said accepted Commission and institution and any other office or department supplying supplies at the expense of the State may negotiate with the Board of State Supplies and make the arrangements as to the delivery of the supplies as they may be deemed expedient.

SECTION 3. The Board of State Supplies shall annually in November, publish in the State newspaper a general catalog of State supplies for the year, and furnish to all departments and offices of State supplies estimated requirements for the year, estimated on the first day of January next ensuing. The supplies shall be classified as far as practicable in a manner so that any officer may readily ascertain the value of supplies usually handled by dealers or carriers of the various kinds. The advertisements shall state that the specification of such supplies may be obtained from the Board of State Supplies and that the supplies may be purchased from the Board of State Supplies and the same will be delivered.

and where such proposals will be made, each proposal shall designate the nature, kind, quality and estimated amount of coal required. The proposals shall be placed in the receptacle at the place and time, at the time and place specified. Every sample of coal shall be accompanied with a duly certified copy of the number of tons per cent of the estimated amount of coal. The bidder shall guarantee to the bidder upon the execution of the contract to supply coal as and for whom opening the bids the bidder shall carefully consider the same and the contract or contracts for the transportation and delivery of coal and supplies to the largest reasonable number of customers for any point the Board may, in its judgment, for the convenience of the company, make of such cities. If two or more persons, firms and corporations agree to bid an amount for any specific distribution of coal, the Board will determine by lot to which of such equal bidders the coal will be awarded. The successful bidder will enter into a contract with the Board which will provide, and shall have a right to require of the bidder to supply coal in an amount to be agreed upon the basis of one thousand dollars per ton of coal, and contracts may therefore be entered into for a time sufficient to cover emergencies. The coal may be transported by railroads or by water, or by land vehicles, and no individual or firm shall be compelled to submit any proposal, and no individual or firm shall be compelled to accept any proposal.

SECTION 4. The Board reserves the right to cancel any contract to enter into a contract and to award the same to another bidder if the price of coal or coal products offered by the other bidder is lower than his or her present or proposed price to the Board. The Board will proceed to award the contract to the lowest bidder who has submitted and enforced the necessary agreements and conditions of the contract required by the Board from time to time.

SECTION 5. The Board, on or before the 1st day of January, 1930, will issue a circular to whom supplies are to be furnished, specifying the quantity of coal to be furnished,

first in each year, submit to the Board of State Supplies full and detailed estimates, specifying as nearly as possible the amount, kind and quality of all supplies that may be required by such offices, boards or departments after the first day of January for the year next ensuing. The cost of the supplies required for each office, board or department shall be incurred in the estimated sum appropriated for the use of such office, board or department.







AN ACT amending the section entitled "Limitation of Actions" in the Session Laws of Wyoming, 1912, relating to the filing of transcript of any judgment of any United States District Court, or of any court of the State, in any cause, in which that in which the judgment was rendered, and in the time hereinupon remaining of the judgment delivered in the county where the same is rendered.

Section 1. That section 1 of the Statute of Limitations, 1890, be amended so as to provide that no action for recovery of damages, shall be allowed unless the same is commenced within one year from the date of the cause of action.
