As it is the duty of the State to provide for the

SECTION 1. The State Supplies shall be established  
consisting of the Treasurer, Auditor and State Engineer. Two members  
shall constitute a quorum.

SECTION 2. The State Supplies shall be established in the State  
for any executive or administrative office of the State, except  
the State University and the State Highway Commission, shall be furnished  
only in pursuance to the terms of a contract or contract or contracts  
made by the Board of State Supplies and the person furnishing or performing  
the same. The said accepted Commission and Institution and any other office  
or board preparing supplies at the expense of the State by contract with  
said Board of State Supplies shall be subject to the same and shall be  
they may be made subject.

SECTION 3. The Board of State Supplies shall annually in  
November advertise in at least one newspaper published in the  
State for at least four weeks in advance of the first day of January  
and supplies estimated to be required for the year, beginning on the first  
day of January next ensuing. Such supplies shall be classified as far as  
practicable in such manner that any order may be submitted to the State  
of supplies legally filled by dealers or purveyors of the various kinds.  
The advertisements shall state that the same will be filled for such supplies  
may be ordered from the Secretary of State, and that the same will be



first in each year, submit to the Board of State Supplies full and detailed estimates, specifying as far as is possible the amount, kind and quality of all supplies that may be required by each officer, boards or departments after the first day of January for the year next ensuing. The cost of the supplies required for each office, board or department shall be entered in the estimates and if necessary the item shall be entered in the list of each office, board or department.

SECTION 10. The term "supplies" as used in this act shall be construed to mean and include all articles and materials, such as paper, printing, ink, and all other things required for use in the office, service and functions performed by the several officers, boards and departments and the State of Ohio, including the State legislative department and the State of Ohio, and the State of Ohio the Capital Building.

SECTION 11. The Board of State Supplies shall be authorized to employ a competent clerk at a salary to be fixed by the Board, and under the supervision of the Board shall have the duty to receive all supplies and shall perform such other duties as may be required.

SECTION 12. The Board of State Supplies shall be authorized to set apart for the use of the State of Ohio a certain amount of money for the purchase of the supplies, and shall have the right to do so.

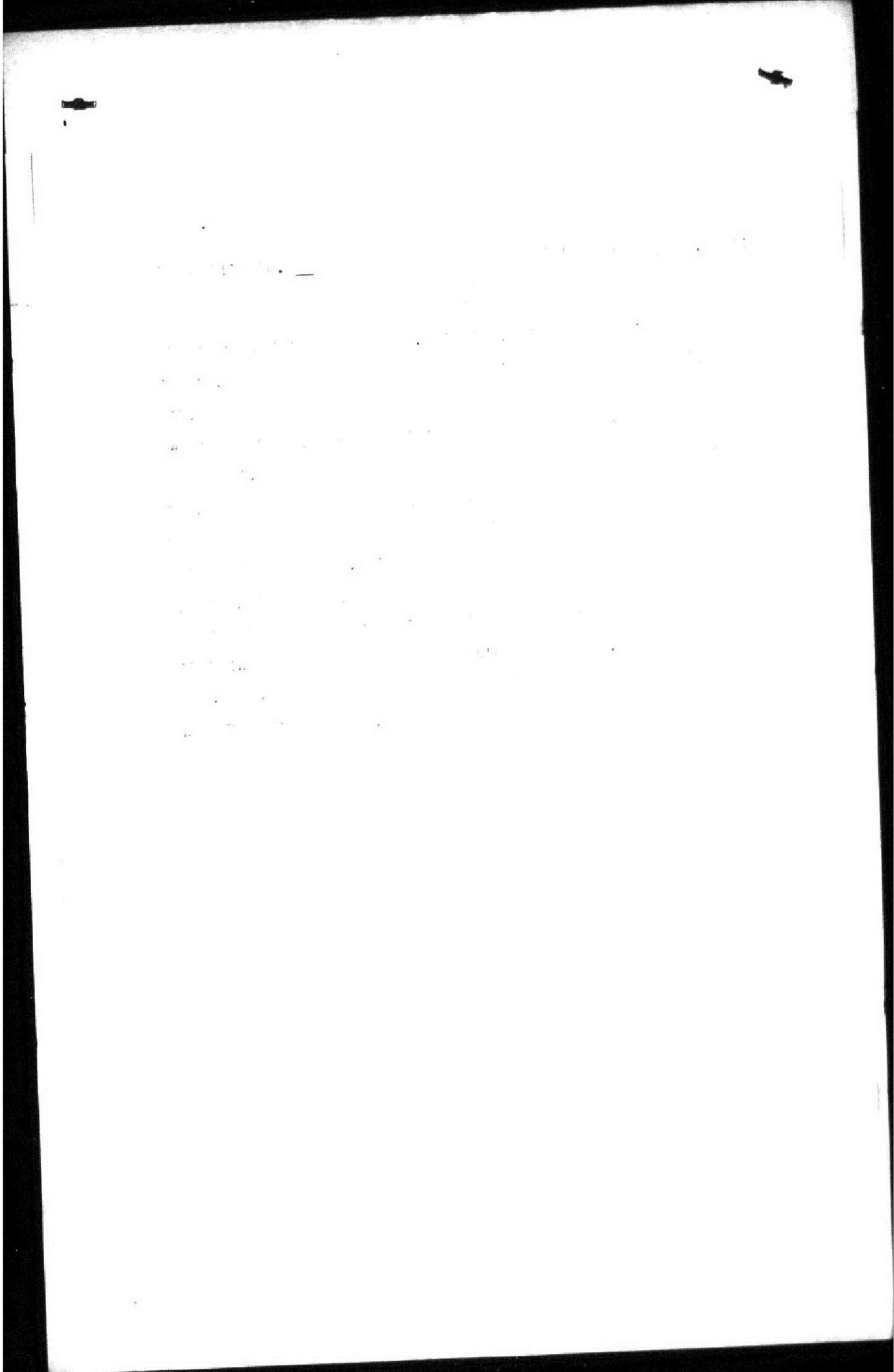
SECTION 13. There is hereby appropriated to the Board of State Supplies in the State Treasury, the sum of Twenty thousand dollars to be used by the Board of State Supplies for the two years next ensuing, and the Board of State Supplies shall have the right to substitute a revolving fund of the same amount for the purpose of carrying on the business of the Board of State Supplies and to increase or decrease the same as may be deemed proper by the Board of State Supplies.

SECTION 10. All the net parts of Article 10 shall be in the  
provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 11. This act shall take effect on the 1st day of January from  
and after its passage.

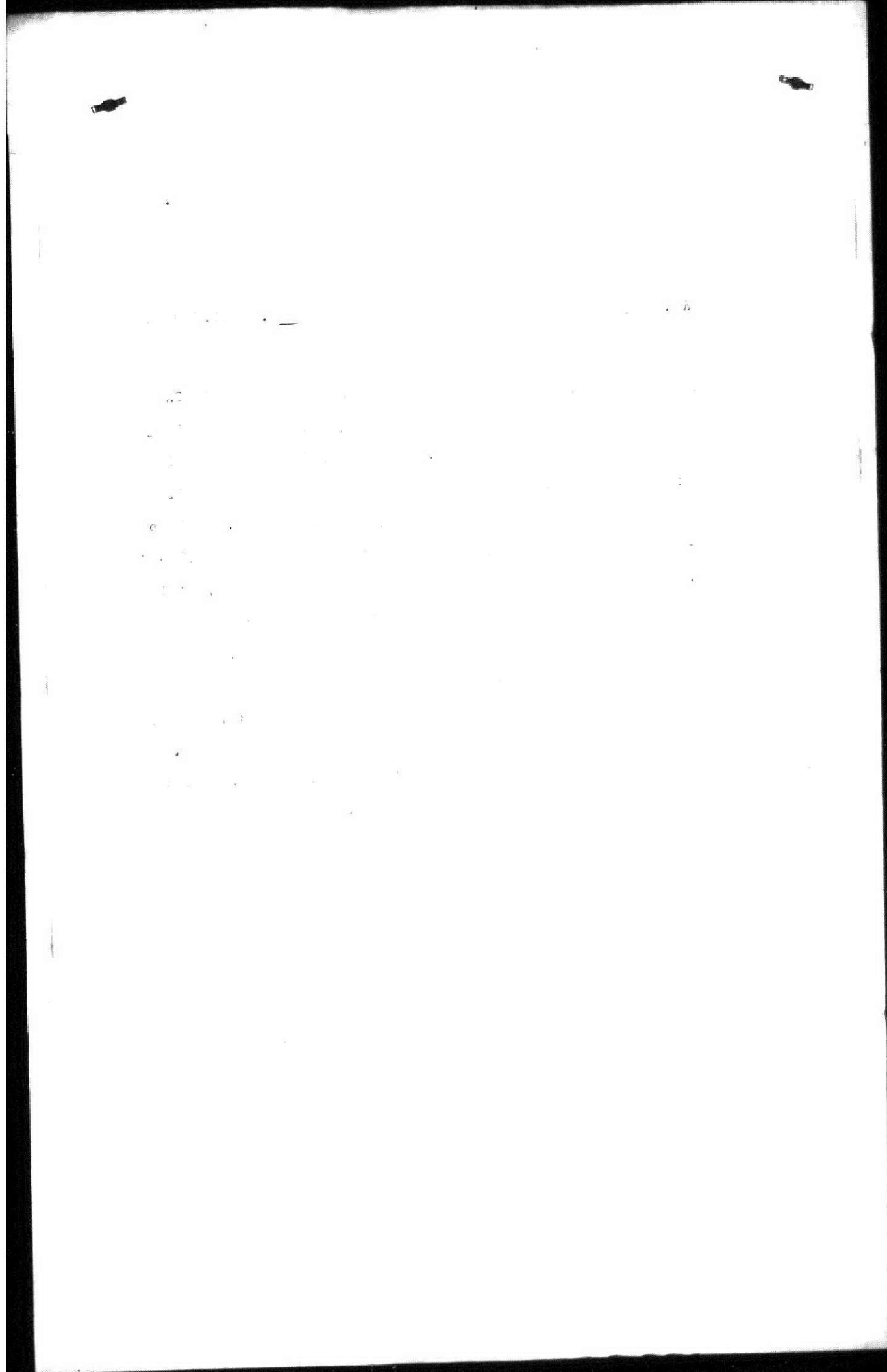
