Dear Harold:

House Bill 191 has passed third reading in the Wyoming State Senate with the following amendment offered by Senator Hitchcock:

Page 3, Line 14 after 1975 insert: "The Board may authorize increased monthly benefits to not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for members who retired and who were credited with at least ten (10) years of service."

You will recall that you and I discussed this amendment proposed by Senator Hitchcock earlier. The Retirement Board and the Director of the Retirement System believe that the amendment is completely inappropriate. If the Board would elect to implement this proposal, it would damage the financial integrity of the System. As you know, the Retirement System has been on a sound actuarial basis since its inception in 1953.

We also believe that it would create some serious distortions in the System and in payments made to retired employees. Example: An individual with ten years of part-time service under this amendment would be eligible to receive a larger monthly benefit than some other employee with 9½ years of full-time service. There is no equitable way that this provision for a minimum monthly payment can be implemented.

We believe that this particular amendment should be stricken from House Bill 191 and that the legislation should contain only those features enacted by the Wyoming House of Representatives. We would hope that the conferees appointed from the House to resolve this matter, take action to delete the amendment. Your support of this request would be very deeply appreciated.
