Chapter 187

GOVERNMENT TRAVEL-MILEAGE

Original House Bill No. 251

AN ACT relating to administration of the government; specifying mileage allowance for government officers and employees who are required to travel in the performance of their duties; and providing for an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

Section 1. W.S. 9-3-103(a)(iii) is amended to read:

9-3-103. Transportation expenses; limitation on longevity or length-of-service allowances.

(a) Any state, county or precinct officer or employee required to travel in the performance of the duties of his office is entitled to receive reimbursement for all actual and necessary transportation expenses incurred as provided by one (1) of the following methods:

(iii) If private vehicle transportation is used, reimbursement is based on a mileage allowance of not more than twenty three cents (\$.23) per mile to exceed the rates charged by the state motor vehicle management system to state agencies for daily use of motor pool vehicles, as determined by the governor for the state and by the governing body of any other entity, except that for the period July 1, 1996, through June 30, 2000, the allowance shall be not more than twenty-eight cents (\$.28) per mile only if a state vehicle is not available as shown by written documentation from the agency in charge of the state vehicle. If a state vehicle is available for use by the officer or employee required to travel, the reimbursement rate shall be not more than twenty-three cents (\$.23) per mile.

Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 1999.
