This board regulates the engineering and land surveying professions within the state. They review the qualifications of individuals, corporations and partnerships registered in other states, and administer examinations for new applicants in Wyoming. Additionally, they conduct investigations of complaints against professionals and firms, and take appropriate disciplinary action when warranted.

Basic Facts

This licensing board was established in 1907 to protect the public from incompetent, unethical or unlicensed practice of engineering and land surveying. Additionally the board promotes excellence in these professions. The board operates with three employees and a biennium budget of \$650,233. The board is entirely self supporting, and uses license fees to support its operations. Currently, the board has the following numbers of active licensees:
