An act to amend and re-enact section 2546 of the revised Statutes of Wyoming relating to recording of mining location certificate and the requisites of said certificate.

AS IT EXISTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

Section 1. That section 2546 of the revised Statutes of Wyoming 1890, be amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

Section 2546. A discoverer of any mineral lead, lode, ledge or vein shall, within sixty days from the date of discovery, cause such claim to be recorded in the office of the county Clerk and ex-officio register of deeds of the County within which such claim may exist, by a location certificate which shall contain the following facts:

1. The name of the lode claim.
2. The name or names of the locator or locators.
3. The date of location.
4. The length of the claim along the vein measured each way from from the center of the discovery shaft, and the general course of the vein as far as it is known.
5. The amount of surface ground claimed on either side of the center of the discovery shaft or discovery workings.
6. A description of the claim by such designation of natural or fixed object, as shall identify the claim beyond question.

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and af-
