A B I L L
FOR

AN ACT to prohibit the indiscriminate disposal of garbage, trash, litter debris, or refuse of any kind; to authorize enforcement; and to provide a penalty for violations.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to throw, dump, place or dispose of in any manner, any garbage, trash, litter, rubbish, debris, carcass or parts of dead animals, wrecked or abandoned vehicles, equipment and machinery or parts thereof, tin cans, scrap iron, glass, bottles, or any substance which would be likely to injure any person, animal or vehicle, or which would in any way detract from the appearance of the land along or on any road, highway, street, or upon other public property, including state and federal lands, or in any lake, ditch, stream, or other body of water, or upon the privately owned property of another without permission of the owner, or in any place or manner except where the disposal of such refuse is authorized; provided, that where no provision is made for disposal, such refuse may be disposed of by burying the same in the ground in such a manner that there will be no stench, or contamination of any water, nor possible harm to people or animals.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of all peace officers, including highway patrolmen, deputy game wardens and fire wardens to enforce this Act within their jurisdiction.

Section 3. Any and all persons who shall violate any of the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor for the first

offense and shall be punished upon conviction by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) or be imprisoned in the county jail for not more than ninety (90) days, or both by such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court; and if such throwing or depositing of glass or other injurious substance upon any road, highway or public property or private lands of another is shown to have been done maliciously with intent to injure either a person, property, or any livestock, then upon conviction the person so offending shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and punished by imprisonment in the county jail not more than one (1) year.
