## NOTICE AND ORDER SETTING PUBLIC HEARING

(Issued May 6, 2016)

- 1. Pursuant to the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act and the Wyoming Public Service Commission's (Commission) Rules, notice is hereby given that a public hearing has been scheduled regarding the application of Cheyenne Light, Fuel and Power Company (Cheyenne Light or the Company) requesting authority to implement a Large Power Contract Service tariff. The public hearing is set to commence on Wednesday, June 1, 2016, at 9:00 a.m., in the Commission's hearing room located at 2515 Warren Avenue, Suite 300, in Cheyenne, Wyoming. The hearing will continue through June 3, 2016, as necessary.
- 2. Cheyenne Light is a public utility as defined in W.S. § 37-1-101(a)(vi)(C), providing retail electric public utility service under Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity issued by the Commission. Cheyenne Light is subject to the Commission's jurisdiction pursuant to W.S. § 37-2-112.
- 3. Cheyenne Light filed its application on October 1, 2015, together with testimony and exhibits requesting authority to implement a Large Power Contract Service tariff to be effective January 1, 2016. Cheyenne Light states in its application that the Large Power Contract Service tariff will enable Cheyenne Light to implement a unique service mechanism that accommodates customers who plan to bring new loads equal to or in excess of 13,000 kW to the Company's service area. The Company also states that the driving principles behind the proposed tariff are: [i] protection of existing retail customers; [ii] creation of a service model that will allow new large customers to grow their business at their own pace; and [iii] development of a service model that satisfies those objectives while simultaneously providing Cheyenne Light an opportunity to generate earnings.
- 4. The proposed tariff does not provide for specific rates to be approved but requires a contract that will outline those rates. Due to the unique nature of the tariff, each contract will be tailored to each customer's needs and will result in different rates.
- 5. All interested persons are encouraged to attend the public hearing which will be conducted in accordance with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act and the Wyoming Public Service Commission Rules and Special Regulations. Interested persons may appear and be heard, either in person or through counsel, as provided by Commission rule.
