(b) The members of the council shall receive no compensation, but shall be reimbursed under W.S. 9-3-102 and 9-3-103.

(c) A majority of the members of the council is a quorum for the transaction of its business.

(d) The council shall hold regular meetings each March, June, September and December. Special meetings of the council may be held on call of the chairman.

(e) The council shall counsel and advise the director. When authorized by the director the council may hold hearings pursuant to the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act.

9-2-216. Authority and powers of department.

(a) The department may with respect to water development:

(i) Receive funds from any source for executing the plans and investigations;

(ii) Do all things necessary for the orderly and planned development, improvement and extension of public works and of private works by agreement with the proper parties;

(iii) Finance or assist the financing of any projects and plans, including those stated in this act;

(iv) Lend money and property to departments and agencies of the state and local governments and to persons in accordance with law and at interest rates, with security, upon terms and for purposes the director deems consistent with the purposes of this act. In connection with the loans, the department may foreclose any security instruments or otherwise take possession of the security and hold, own, manage, construct improvements on, improve, maintain and operate properties or assets. Title to all property shall be in the state of Wyoming;

(A) Design, construct, acquire, purchase, operate and maintain water development projects for the conservation, storage, distribution and use of water, or any feature, facility, function or portion of a project;

(B) Contract for the performance of any power under subparagraph (A) of this paragraph, and consult with or employ experts and professional persons;

(C) Acquire by purchase, lease, appropriation, gift, exchange or eminent domain, necessary land, easements and other property for construction, operation and maintenance of water projects and accept gifts, grants and contributions of money from any source;

(D) Acquire by purchase, lease, appropriation, development, gift or exchange necessary water rights for construction, operation and maintenance of water projects and accept gifts, grants and contributions of money from any source;

(E) Collect revenues from water projects pledged to secure revenue bonds, when authorized to finance a project of the Wyoming water development program, and pool revenues from one (1) or more projects constructed or operated by the department;

(F) Contract for the sale, lease or furnishing and delivery of water service, water rights, water storage or hydroelectric power, and fix charges, rates, rents, fees and tolls;

(G) Acquire, operate and maintain any interest in any facility or function of a project constructed by the United States, a legal subdivision of the state, a special district, private corporation or person;

(H) Contract with, contribute to or receive contributions from any legal subdivision of the state, special district, private corporation or person for the construction, operation, management and maintenance of any project or any interest in any facility or function of a project.

9-2-217. Assistance, assets and monies; receipt by director; designated uses; deposit of monies with state treasurer; expenditures and loans.

(a) Under the direction of the governor, the director may receive assistance, assets and monies donated, contributed, loaned or allotted by any national resources board or other federal agency, by other states or from any other source. The monies, together with the proceeds from the sale of any assets shall be used in the investigation, furtherance, construction, financing, operation and maintenance of any works or projects within the authorized activities of the department.

(b) All monies shall be deposited with the state treasurer in the appropriate fund and account and expended by the department or loaned according to law to local, state or federal agencies, departments or subdivisions to carry out departmental duties and the purposes of this act. Loans shall be made in a manner and upon terms determined by the director. Monies and proceeds from the sale of assets donated, contributed, loaned or allotted for a particular or special purpose shall be expended, loaned or otherwise made available only in accordance with the purpose for which received.

9-2-218. Director's responsibilities; cooperation with state engineer; powers and duties.

(a) The director is responsible for the conservation, planning and development of the water resources of this state. He shall cooperate with the state engineer, without duplication of effort.

(b) The director shall consult with the council and the state engineer and shall:

(i) Formulate the policies and programs to be carried out by the department;

(ii) Conduct studies and carry on any type of activity in connection with investigation, financing and construction of proposed physical projects relating to the conservation, storage, distribution and use of water. Every subpoena directed to an individual shall advise the individual of his right to appear with and be represented by an attorney.

(d) The county and prosecuting attorney, district attorney, attorney general and their deputies are empowered to administer oaths to all witnesses summoned to testify by process or who voluntarily appear to testify.

(a) Except as otherwise provided in W.S. 37-9-902, any railroad operating as a common carrier in this state shall not run or permit to be run over its tracks outside of yard limits any train transporting hazardous materials, without having attached thereto as the rear car, a properly equipped and maintained caboose occupied, when moving, by a qualified train service conductor or a brakeman, or both. Within yard or terminal limits, a caboose is also required on yard to yard or transfer movements of such trains if the movements exceed one (1) mile.

(b) As used in this article "hazardous materials" means those materials as defined in 49 Code of Federal Regulations 171.8.

37-9-902. Exceptions to caboose requirements.

(a) Caboose are not required on passenger trains or on freight trains not transporting hazardous materials, and in cases of emergency occurring on line of road which will not permit compliance with W.S. 37-9-901.

(b) A defective car that cannot be entrained except behind the caboose may be the rear car from the point entrained, on line of road, to the first terminal where repairs can be made.

37-9-903. Penalty. Any railroad violating W.S. 37-9-901 is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each offense. Each violation constitutes a separate offense.
