

### A BILL

for

1 AN ACT to amend W.S. 9-5-212 relating to employer retire-  
2 ment contributions; increasing the employer contribution  
3 rate; and providing for an effective date.

4 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

5 Section 1. W.S. 9-5-212 is amended to read:

6 9-5-212. Contributions by employer; contributions to  
7 be transferred to fund; recovery of delinquent contribu-  
8 tions; interest. Each employer shall pay into the fund a  
9 ~~matching~~ contribution equal to five and ~~fifty-seven~~  
10 SIXTY-EIGHT hundredths percent ~~(5.57%)~~ (5.68%) of the

1 salary paid to each of its employees covered under the act  
2 and may pay into the fund any amount of the employees'  
3 share of retirement contributions. These ~~matching~~ con-  
4 tributions, together with the employees' contributions, if  
5 any, shall be transferred and credited to the fund in a  
6 manner as directed by the board, and if the contributions  
7 are not transferred to the board when due, they may be re-  
8 covered, together with interest at the rate of eight per-  
9 cent (8%) per annum, in an action brought for that purpose  
10 in the district court in and for the county in which the  
11 employer has its principal office or place of activity.

12 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon  
13 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law  
14 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Con-  
15 stitution.
