

Park County gets its name from Yellowstone National Park. Part of the National Park lies within Park County. The county seat, Cody, is named after Buffalo Bill Cody. A museum and historical center located in Cody are also named after the famous showman. The fourth largest county in terms of area is populated by 26,664 residents. This represents an increase in population from the 2000 estimate of 25,786. The Shoshone National Forest covers part of the 6,942 square mile county.

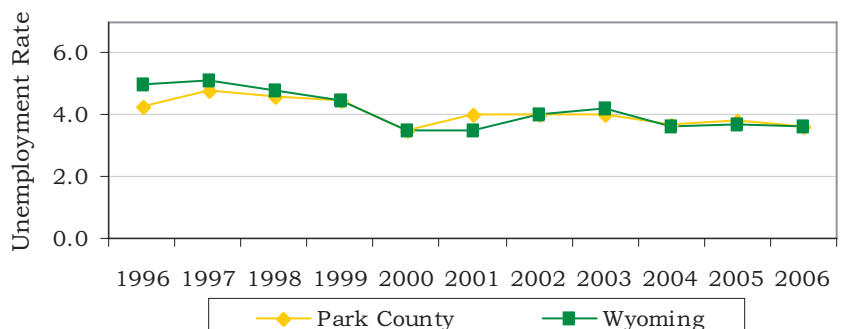

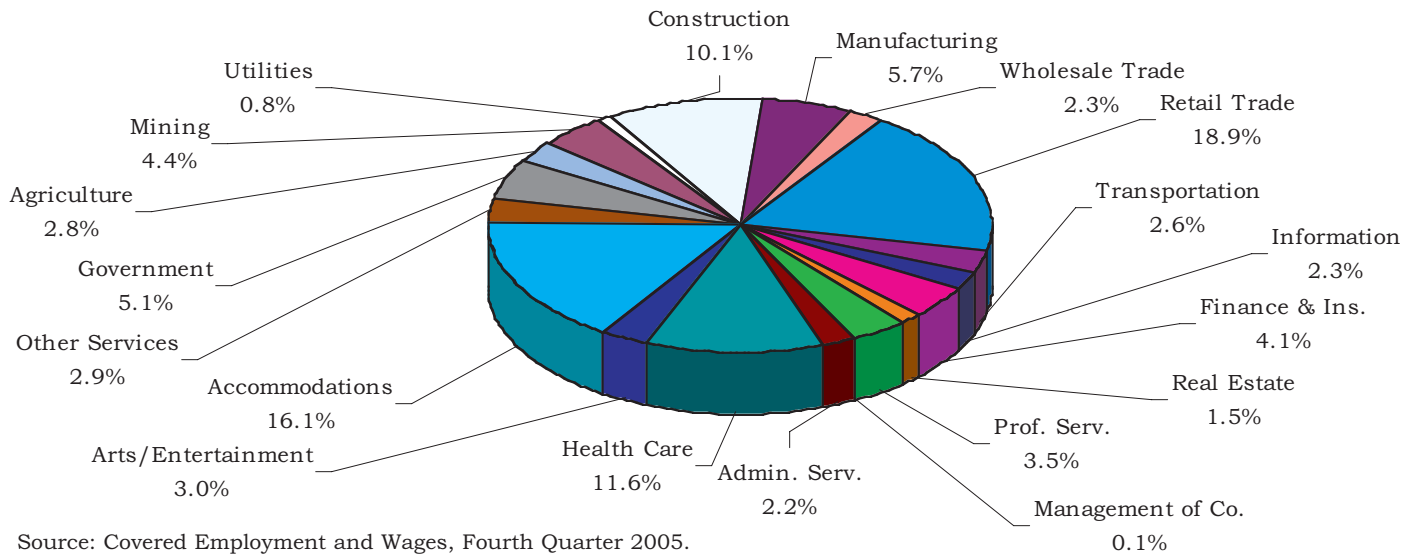

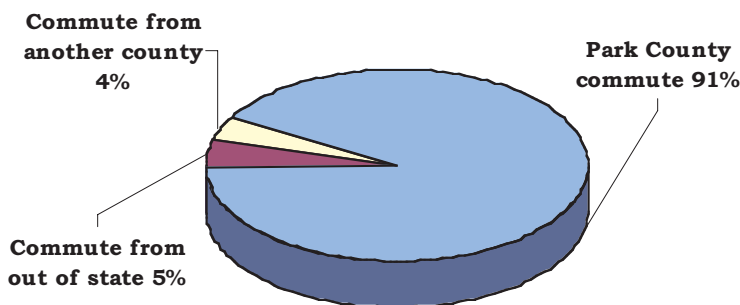
