- 1 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
- 2 Section 1. W.S. 9-2-116 is created to read:
- 3 9-2-116. Health policy board. There is created a 4 health policy board which shall review and approve the 5 state health plan. The board consists of seven (7) mem-6 bers appointed by the governor. In the initial appoint-7 ments, the membership shall be appointed to the extent 8 possible from the statewide health coordinating council 9 appointed by the governor under Public Law 93-641 as it 10 existed on September 30, 1986. In the initial appointments, four (4) members shall be appointed for four (4) 11 12 years and three (3) members for two (2) years. 13 ter, members shall be appointed for four (4) year terms 14 from a list of nominees submitted by the director of the 15 department of health and social services containing twice 16 the number of vacancies to be filled. Terms shall expire 17 on March 1 during the year of expiration. A majority of 18 the members shall be persons who are consumers and not 19 providers of health care as defined in W.S. 35-2-202. 20 Except in the initial appointments, one (1) member shall 21 be appointed from each appointment district under W.S. 22 9-1-218.
