

CHAPTER 100.

House Bill No. 129.

RELATING TO THE SITE OF THE HOME OF THE FEEBLE MINDED.

AN ACT authorizing a change in the location of the site of the Wyoming Home of the Feeble Minded and Epileptic, and making a further appropriation for the construction and maintenance of that Institution.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

AUTHORIZED.

Section 1. The State Board of Charities and Reform are hereby authorized and empowered to sell the present site of the Wyoming Home of the Feeble Minded and Epileptic, commonly known as the State Poor Farm, consisting of one hundred sixty-eight and eleven twenty-fourths acres of land near the Town of Lander in Fremont County, State of Wyoming, and to purchase in lieu thereof a more suitable site nearer to the Town of Lander, and of a more or less acreage as the Board may determine.

UPON THE SALE.

Sec. 2. Upon the sale of the present site of the Wyoming Home of the Feeble Minded and Epileptic, as provided in Section 1 of this act, the Governor of the State is hereby authorized and empowered to execute on behalf of the State the proper and necessary deeds of conveyance, or other evidences of sale, to the purchaser thereof.

APPROPRIATION.

Sec. 3. The sum of twenty-five thousand dollars, together with the proceeds of the sale of the land as provided in this act, and all the proceeds of the tax levy authorized by Chapter 104 of the Session Laws of 1907, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the State Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to be used for the purchase of the new site herein authorized, and the carrying out of the provisions of law relative to the establishment of the Wyoming Home of the Feeble Minded and Epileptic.

SHALL PREPARE.

Sec. 4. The State Board of Charities and Reform shall prepare and adopt such plans and specifications for the grounds buildings and fixtures for said Institution of such form, style and dimensions as will,

when completed, come within the sum by this act appropriated for that purpose, and shall in all respects carry out the provisions of law heretofore or hereafter enacted relative to same.

Sec. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
