  - 9-231. Senate committee. There is hereby established a standing committee of the WYOMING senate of this states to be officially known as the senate committee on intergovernmental cooperation, and to consist of five (5) senators. The members and the chairman of this committee shall be designated in the same manner as is customary in the case of members and chairmen of other standing committees of the senate. In addition to the regular members, the president of the senate shall be ex-officio IS an honorary non-voting EX OFFICIO NONVOTING member of this committee.



9-232. House committee. There is hereby established a similar standing committee of the WYOMING house of representatives of this state, to be officially known as the house committee on intergovernmental cooperation, and to consist of five (5) members of the house of representatives. The members and the chairman of this committee shall be designated in the same manner as is customery in the case of the house of representatives. In addition to the regular members, the speaker of the house of representatives in addition to sentatives shall—be ex-officio IS an honorary—non-voting EX OFFICIO NONVOTING member of this committee.

9-233. Governor's committee. There is hereby established a committee of administrative officials and employees of this state to—be—officially known as the governor's committee on intergovernmental cooperation, and to consist of five (5) members. Its members shall be the budget director or the corresponding official of this state, ex-officio; the attorney general, ex-officio; the chief of the staff of the state planning board or the corresponding official of this state, ex-officio; and two (2) other administrative officials or employees to—be designated by the governor. If there is uncertainty as to the identity of any of the ex-officio EX OFFICIO members of
