

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT to amend W.S. 27-4-202 relating to minimum wages;  
2 increasing the minimum hourly wage rate; decreasing the  
3 percentage amount by which tips are considered to increase  
4 the applicable minimum wage; altering the definition of  
5 "tip" employee; and providing for an effective date.

6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

7 Section 1. W.S. 27-4-202 is amended to read:

8 27-4-202. Minimum wage rates.

9 (a) EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1981, every employer shall pay

1 to each of his or her employees, wages at a rate of not  
2 less than ~~one-dollar-and-forty-cents-(\$1.40)-per-hour-from~~  
3 ~~June--17--1971,--to-December-31,--1971,--one-dollar-and-fifty~~  
4 ~~cents-(\$1.50)-per-hour-from-January-1,--1972--to--December~~  
5 ~~31,--1972,--and-one-dollar~~ THREE DOLLARS and ~~sixty~~ THIRTY-  
6 FIVE cents ~~(\$1.60)~~ (\$3.35) per hour, ~~thereafter.~~

7 (b) For the purpose of this law ARTICLE, in deter-  
8 mining the wage rate of a tipped employee, the amount paid  
9 such employee by his employer ~~shall be~~ IS deemed to be  
10 increased on account of tips received by an employee by an  
11 amount not in excess of ~~fifty~~ FORTY percent ~~(50%)~~ (40%) of  
12 the applicable minimum wage. ~~Provided,--however,--in--all~~  
13 ~~cases-the-minimum-wage-paid-by-an-employer-to-his-employee~~  
14 ~~shall--not--be--less-than-one-dollar-and-ten-cents-(\$1.10)~~  
15 ~~per-hour-effective-June-17-1971-and--thereafter.~~ For the  
16 purposes of this act, all "tip" employees shall furnish  
17 monthly to their respective employers the daily record of  
18 tips required to be kept by "tip" employees under the laws  
19 of the United States and upon the forms prescribed by the  
20 internal revenue service of the United States treasury  
21 department. ~~Said~~ THE daily record of tips ~~shall consti-~~  
22 ~~tute~~ CONSTITUTES prima facie proof of the amount of tips  
23 received by such an employee. Proof of a customary tipping  
24 percentage of sales or service ~~shall also be~~ IS an admis-

1 sible form of proof of the amount of tips. A "tip"  
2 employee is one who customarily and regularly receives  
3 more than ~~twenty~~ THIRTY dollars (~~\$20.00~~) (\$30.00) a month  
4 in tips.

5 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 1981.
