 - (a) EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1981, every employer shall pay

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to each of his or her employees, wages at a rate of not less than ene-dellar-and-forty-cents-(\$1.40)-per-heur-from June--17--19717-to-December-317-19717-one-dellar-and-fifty eents-(\$1.50)-per-heur-from-January-17--1972--to--December 317--19727--and-one-dellar THREE DOLLARS and sixty THIRTY-FIVE cents (\$1.60) (\$3.35) per hour.7-thereafter.

Proof of a customary tipping 23 24 percentage of sales or service shall-also-be IS an admis-

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sible form of proof of the amount of tips. A "tip" employee is one who customarily and regularly receives more than twenty THIRTY dollars (\$20.00) a month in tips.
