Section 1 of this bill reduces the interest rate from 6% to 4% on the PWMTF loan to the City of Laramie, Albany County territorial park. This interest rate reduction results in an annual loss of \$200,000 for the next 20 years, for a total of \$4,000,000 in reduced interest earnings.

Section 2 of this bill contains an appropriation of \$3,481,000 from the GAAP holding account to the the territorial park account within the special revenue fund, to be invested by the State Treasurer. The principal and interest will be used to pay the annual

\$400,000 interest payment for the remaining term of the loan.
