BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

Section 1. That Section 21-32, Wyoming Statutes 1957, as amended and re-enacted by Section 8, Chapter 109, Session Laws of Wyoming 1959, is amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

The STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION THROUGH THE State Superintendent of Public Instruction OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION shall have power to revoke a teacher's certificate upon evidence of a gross neglect of duty, incompetency, immorality, or other reprehensible conduct. Such evidence must be presented in written charges and no certificate shall be revoked without a personal hearing unless the holder thereof shall refuse or fail to appear for such hearing.
