5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

6 Section 1. W.S. 9-6-301 is created to read:

**NO SIGNIFICANT FISCAL OR
PERSONNEL IMPACT AT STATE LEVEL**

1 (a) No state or county agency shall take any action
2 including, but not limited to, permitting or any other
3 action that would authorize or permit the construction,
4 maintenance or operation of a high-level radioactive waste
5 storage, transfer or disposal facility, whether temporary
6 or permanent, within this state unless the question of
7 whether such activity should be permitted is submitted to
8 and approved by a majority of the qualified electors
9 residing in this state or the legislature has approved the
10 activity after a nonbinding vote under subsection (f) of
11 this section.

12 (b) The question of whether to allow the activities
13 set forth in subsection (a) of this section may be submit-
14 ted to electors at a primary, general or special election
15 if the secretary of state receives a petition requesting a
16 vote on the question or adopts a resolution to that
17 effect. The petition shall be signed by at least ten
18 percent (10%) of the qualified electors of this state, as
19 determined by the number of votes cast in the most recent
20 general election.

21 (c) The question shall appear on the ballot as speci-
22 fied by law in substantially the following form: "Shall a
23 storage, transfer or disposal facility for high-level

1 radioactive waste be allowed in this state?"

3 (d) If the question is defeated, it shall not again
4 be submitted to the electors of this state for at least
5 five (5) years.

6 (e) As used in this section, "high-level radioactive
7 waste" means:

8 (i) Irradiated reactor fuel;

9 (ii) Liquid wastes resulting from operation of
10 the first cycle solvent extraction system or its equiva-
11 lent, including the concentrated wastes from subsequent
12 extraction cycles or its equivalent, in a facility for
13 reprocessing irradiated reactor fuel; or

14 (iii) Any solids into which the liquid wastes in
15 paragraph (ii) of this subsection have been converted.

16 (f) If the legislature so directs at the next general
17 election, and notwithstanding any other provision of law,
18 the secretary of state shall certify the following
19 nonbinding proposition on the ballot after other proposi-
20 tions in substantially the following format:

1 Nonbinding Ballot Proposition

2 This is a nonbinding ballot proposition. It has
3 no legal effect but is intended to assist the
4 legislature in assessing public support for the
5 legislation printed below. If the public votes
6 in opposition to this legislation, the legisla-
7 ture will have an opportunity to amend or repeal
8 it before it becomes effective.

11 Section 2. The nonbinding ballot proposition in W.S.
12 9-6-301(f) of this act is intended to provide the voters
13 an opportunity to express their opinion regarding the leg-
14 islation proposed by this act so that any subsequent leg-
15 islature has an opportunity to make any changes to the
16 proposed legislation.

17 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon
18 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
19 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Consti-
20 tution.
