WHEREAS, John E. Wendt rendered Sweetwater County and this state of Wyoming a most distinguished service; and

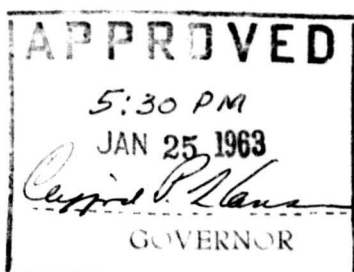
WHEREAS, John E. Wendt was born in Scofield, Utah, on February 7, 1907, was educated in Rock Springs, Wyoming, graduated from Rock Springs High School; and

WHEREAS, John E. Wendt interested himself in the civic affairs of Sweetwater County during his lifetime, a former member of the City Council of the City of Rock Springs, a member of the Railroad Brotherhood Union, and was employed as a carman for the Union Pacific Railroad Company; and

WHEREAS, John E. Wendt was a member of the Democratic Party all of his adult life, holding several positions in the party and served three terms in the Wyoming House of Representatives serving from 1956 until his death on August 2, 1961 at the age of 54 years;
