

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT to create W.S. 41-29.3 relating to the impoundment
2 of facilities; and providing for an effective date.

3 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

4 Section 1. W.S. 41-29.3 is created to read:

5 41-29.3. Impoundment of facilities.

6 (a) Any holder or owner of an adjudicated surface
7 water right, for irrigation purposes, in and to the use of
8 waters of any natural stream in Wyoming who wishes to
9 impound return or waste waters, resulting from irrigation
10 upon the lands to which said water right is attached, for
11 reuse upon said lands shall obtain a prior approval of the
12 division superintendent or state engineer.

13 (b) The impoundment for reuse may be allowed pro-
14 vided:

15 (i) Any water impounded for reuse shall be

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1 captured upon the lands for which appropriated prior to
2 reaching a natural drainage or channel;

3 (ii) The waters shall be reused only upon
4 lands to which they were originally appropriated;

5 (iii) The waters shall not be used to expand
6 the acreage actually historically beneficially irrigated
7 prior to construction of the waste water recovery system;

8 (iv) Any impoundment constructed to collect
9 the waste water must not intercept waters not resulting
10 from irrigation upon the lands to which the water rights
11 sought to be impounded are attached;

12 (v) If any impoundment constructed under the
13 provisions of this statute should intercept, store or col-
14 lect ground water, it then becomes subject to the appli-
15 cable statutes of the state engineer concerning
16 groundwater appropriation and use;

17 (vi) No impoundment constructed to collect or
18 store waste water shall exceed one (1) acre-foot in capac-
19 ity;

20 (vii) No other existing lawful appropriation
21 shall be injured by the impoundment.

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1 (c) An inspection and report shall be made prior to,
2 and periodically during, the operation of any waste water
3 recovery system by the water commissioner or hydrographer
4 commissioner and filed with the state board of control to
5 assure compliance with the above specified limitations.

6 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 1977.
