Original House Bill No. 27

**ACQUISITION AND OPERATION OF RECREATIONAL SYSTEMS BY
MUNICIPALITIES AND OTHER LEGAL SUBDIVISIONS—
FINANCING THEREOF**

AN ACT authorizing cities, towns, villages, counties and school districts to acquire and operate systems of public recreation and play grounds, and providing for the financing thereof.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

Powers

Section 1. The governing body of any city, town, village, county or school district shall be and hereby is authorized to:

- a. Establish a system of public recreation and playgrounds;
- b. Acquire, equip, and maintain land, buildings or other recreational facilities;
- c. Employ trained supervisors and directors of recreation;
- d. Accept gifts, bequests and federal aids-in-grant for the benefit of the recreational service;
- e. Allocate money and expend funds so allocated for such recreational purposes.

Levies by County Commissioners—Limitation Thereof

Section 2. The Board of County Commissioners is hereby authorized to make levies and expend funds obtained from said levies for the recreational purposes set forth in Section 1. Any such levy imposed for the purposes set forth in Section 1 hereof shall not exceed one mill of the assessed valuation of said city, town, village, county or school district, provided, that the total appropriation for such purpose, whether made singly or in cooperation with other units of government, shall not exceed one mill on the assessed valuation of any political subdivision.

Independent or Joint Action by Legal Subdivisions—Recreation Board

Section 3. Any city, town, village, county or school district may establish such recreation system independently or jointly as they may mutually agree; and shall delegate the operation of such system to a recreation board, having a membership of not less than nine members, created by any or all of them.
