7 20-3-105. Enforcement of child support orders.

8 (a) A court of competent jurisdiction may order an
9 execution against the wages, earned or to be earned, of a

1 parent subject to a judgment or order for child support
2 if:

3 (i) The judgment or order for child support
4 was issued by a Wyoming court or a court of another state
5 which authorizes reciprocal enforcement of Wyoming judg-
6 ments and orders;

7 (ii) A request for wage assignment is filed
8 either by:

9 (A) The custodial parent; or

10 (B) The state of Wyoming when the sup-
11 port rights of a child who is eligible for aid to families
12 with dependent children (42 U.S.C. 601-611) have been
13 assigned to the state;

14 (iii) Child support payments under the judg-
15 ment or order are more than sixty (60) days overdue;

16 (iv) The court issues the execution in a con-
17 tempt proceeding against the parent subject to the child
18 support order and all constitutional and statutory proce-
19 dural requirements are satisfied; and

20 (v) The execution issues the amount of the
21 support order but not more than fifty percent (50%) of the

1 wages of the parent subject to the child support order.

2 (b) An order of execution issued under subsection
3 (a) of this section operates as an assignment and shall
4 bind any present or future employer of the defaulting
5 parent upon whom a copy of the order is served. For costs
6 incurred in administering the wage assignment, the
7 employer may deduct one dollar (\$1.00) for each payment
8 made pursuant to the order.

9 (c) No employer shall use any assignment authorized
10 by this section as grounds for the dismissal of an
11 employee.

12 Section 2. This act is effective June 2, 1980.
