AN ACT to amend and re-enact Section 5-27, Wyoming Statutes, 1957, providing for the appointment of a deputy clerk of the supreme court, designating his place of residence, requiring him to subscribe to an oath, defining his duties, and fixing the salary thereof; and to provide an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

Section 1. That Section 5-27, Wyoming Statutes, 1957, be amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

The clerk of the supreme court may, by and with the consent of the justices of the supreme court, or a majority thereof, appoint a deputy clerk, who shall reside where the supreme court is held. The deputy shall take and subscribe a like oath with his principal and may perform all the duties of said office in the name of his principal, and the attestation of said deputy to all decrees, orders and processes, shall have the same effect and force as if issued by his principal. Said deputy clerk shall receive an annual salary of * * * SIX THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$6,000.00) which shall be paid in monthly installments at the end of each month * * * BY THE STATE TREASURER ON WARRANT OF THE STATE AUDITOR, FOR THAT PURPOSE.

Section 2. This Act shall take effect and be in force on March 1, 1961.
