FISCAL NOTE

This bill contains an appropriation of \$1,407,440 from the GENERAL FUND.

Budget Narrative

Appropriation for 1998 Legislative Session

Senate File 0001 (Engrossed)

Background

As you may recall, the vast majority of the Legislature's budget is contained in the appropriations bill which is considered during the General Session. The appropriations bill for the Legislature during the Budget Session is traditionally limited only to certain actual costs of the Budget Session. This year's recommendation follows that tradition and is explained below. Remember too that the Legislature operates on a legislative biennium (i.e. 2 calendar rather than fiscal years) so that each legislature sets its own budget.

SALARIES

Legislators - Session

Provides funds for legislators salaries for a 20 day session, including the three intervening weekends. Adequate funds remain from the general session for four additional days (not necessarily legislative days)

Note: Five days were carried over from the 35 day General Session, but the Sunday during the June 97 special session required a day beyond the appropriation for the special session.

Session staff

Provides funds for all session only employees (including for training, preparation and wrap up activities) for a 20 day session. Adequate funds remain for 5 additional legislative days.

EMPLOYER PAID BENEFITS

Provides funds for the employer's social security contribution for both legislators and staff and the unemployment insurance premium for session staff.

TRAVEL IN STATE

Mileage session

Provides funds for one round trip to the Capitol for all legislators who are not residents of Cheyenne; also provides funds for session staff who are not Cheyenne residents.

Session per diem

Provides funds for per diem for a 20 day session, including the 3 intervening weekends, for all legislators, including one travel day both before and after each session for all legislators who are not residents of Cheyenne; also provides per diem for eligible session staff (just a couple of staff). (Again, four days in funding remain from the General Session.)

ANNUAL DUES

Provides funds for payment of annual dues for 2 of the 3 organizations to which the Legislature belongs.

Management Council removed funding for CSG. Note that last year, the legislature paid only 1/2 the dues for CSG. The full CSG dues for this year would be \$56,700.

COMMUNICATIONS

Telecommunications - This is for additional funds to augment the appropriation from the General Session of \$117,000.

Telecommunications bills have been extremely high. The payments for Internet access for legislators participating in the program will be about half this \$40k for the biennium; the other half is for higher costs; more phone calls due to an extremely busy interim on school finance. This includes legislators' credit card calls.

OFFICE SUPPLIES/PRINTING

This appropriation is used primarily for printing Session Laws and the supplement pamphlets for updating the statutes after the 1998 Session (normal expenditures); this will also be used for additional photocopying costs resulting from school finance reform.

Section 2. This is standard language.

Section 3.

(a) This appropriation is for committee meetings, consultants and additional LSO staff support for school finance reform. There will be more work done during the 1998 interim, e.g. responding to the required Department of Education recommendations in October, special education, etc.

The Select Committee approved the budget recommendation of \$127,000 for interim work and consultants and \$103,000 is for LSO staff support - total = \$230k.

(b) This appropriation replaces the \$51,500 previously approved by the Council (November) to be expended from the regular legislative budget for extra education reform expenses during the 1997 interim leading up to the 1998 session.

This extra expenditure was due to additional committee meetings and more MAP work because work was accelerated, i.e. instead of waiting until 1999, lots of work was done for this session.

Section 4. This section is to cover costs for convening Feb 9 instead of Feb 16 - these are net of what was left over from the 1997 General Session. (Need funds for 4 days for legislators, not session staff.)

Section 5. This is the Council's response as required by law to the Game and Fish license fee bill from 96. The Management Audit Committee would oversee the process of selecting an independent consultant to perform the evaluation. (LSO will not be performing the evaluation.) The \$50,000 appropriation is just a guess. An independent consultant will not be cheap.
