FIRST DAY.

HALL OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, }
CHEYENNE, Wyo., Jan'y 8, 1884. }

12:15 P. M.

The members of the House of Representatives of the Eighth Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Wyoming were called to order by the Hon. E. S. N. Morgan Secretary of the Territory pursuant to law.

The roll being called the following members appeared and answered to their names, viz:

On motion of Mr. Coad, of Laramie county, Mr. N. N. Craig was elected temporary speaker and J. R. Whitehead temporary chief clerk.

Mr. Seaton then moved that permission be given Mr. Jesse Knight to address the House with reference to the seat to

which Hon. E. S. Crocker had been elected, which motion was by the speaker over-ruled as being out of order, and thereupon Mr. Nickerson, of Sweetwater, moved that a committee of five be appointed by the speaker, whose duty it shall be to call on Chief Justice James B. Sener and request him to administer the oath of office to the members present, which motion was carried, and the speaker appointed as such committee Messrs. Coad, Allen, Groesbeck, Jones and Teschemacher.

On motion of Mr. Quealy, Mr. Nellis Corthrell was elected temporary assistant chief clerk of the House.

On motion the House took a recess for ten minutes to await the coming of Chief Justice Sener.

The mining laws of the U. S. are merely an outline to be filled up by state and territorial legislation, being in themselves vague and imperfect.

1st—The Territorial law now in force making a claim on which \$1000 worth of labor has been done non-relocatable, is in conflict with U. S. laws of 1872, and as said law was passed in 1869 and made void by U. S. law of 1872 should be repealed as tending to increase litigation.

2d—Knowing many of you to be conversant with the mining laws of the state of Colorado and believing them to be as directly applicable to this Territory, we believe the mining interests of Wyoming will be subserved by the passage of the Colorado mining law—the Colorado law as regards mining corporations and the repeal of the Territorial law of 1869.
