Section 1. The following amendment to Article 3,

Section 2 of the Wyoming Constitution is proposed for sub-

mission to the electors of the State of Wyoming at the

next general election for approval or rejection, to become

valid as a part of the constitution if ratified by a

- 1 majority of the electors. The amendment is as follows:
- 2 Article 3, Section 2. Members' terms and qualifica-3 tions. Senators shall be elected for the term of four (4) 4 years and representatives for the term of two (2) years. NO PERSON IS ELIGIBLE FOR ELECTION TO THE SENATE FOR MORE 5 6 THAN THREE (3) CONSECUTIVE TERMS OR TO THE HOUSE OF REPRE-7 SENTATIVES FOR MORE THAN SIX (6) CONSECUTIVE TERMS. The senators elected at the first election shall be divided by 8 9 lot into two (2) classes as nearly equal as may be. The 10 seats of senators of the first class shall be vacated at 11 the expiration of the first two (2) years, and of the second class at the expiration of four (4) years. No 12 13 person shall be a senator who has not attained the age of 14 twenty-five (25) years, or a representative who has not 15 attained the age of twenty-one (21) years, and who is not a citizen of the United States and of this state and who 16 has not, for at least twelve (12) months next preceding 17 18 his election resided within the county or district in which he was elected. 19
- 20 Section 2. The Secretary of State of Wyoming shall 21 endorse the following statement on the proposed amendment.
- The adoption of this amendment will limit to three
