A B I L L

FOR

AN ACT TO REGULATE THE GOVERNMENT OF INSURANCE AGENTS DOING BUSINESS IN THE STATE OF WYOMING, AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ACT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

Section 1. When any agent of any insurance company, society, assurance association or corporation accepts an application for insurance from any person not provided with a certificate of authority as a resident agent as required by law, and in any way compensates or promises to compensate such person for soliciting such application the insurance commissioner shall, upon proof and notice, suspend the license of such agent for a period of not less than three months or revoke same, in his discretion, and if it shall appear to the insurance commissioner that the company for which said agent is acting is guilty of participation in the acts of such agent the insurance commissioner shall suspend the certificate of authority of such company to do business in this State for a period of not less than three months for each and every offence.

This section shall not apply to direct insurance covering rolling stock of railroad companies operating between different states, or property received for shipment from one state to another, while in possession or custody of railroad corporations or other common carriers.

Section 2. All Acts and parts of Acts in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
