THIRTY-FOURTH STATE LEGISLATURE OF  
THE STATE OF WYOMING

AN ACT to amend and re-enact Section 37-417,  
Wyoming Compiled Statutes, 1945,  
providing for the payment and  
disposition of fees for licensing, for  
the State Board of Barber Examiners,  
and requiring bonds of the Secretary-  
Treasurer and members; and to provide  
an effective date of this Act.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

I hereby certify that this Act was originally filed in the House  
Section 1. That Section 37-417, Wyoming Compiled Statutes, 1945, be amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

37-417. The Board shall elect a president, vice president and a secretary-treasurer at the first annual meeting from its members. The secretary-treasurer shall keep the books, temporary funds and records of the Board. Such secretary-treasurer shall furnish a bond with good and sufficient surety to the State of Wyoming in the sum and manner prescribed by the Board of Equalization of the State of Wyoming and conditioned that he shall properly account for all funds coming into his possession, and every other member of the Board shall likewise furnish to the State of Wyoming a bond similarly secured and conditioned.

All fees received by the Board shall be payable to the State Board of Equalization and shall be deposited by the board in a bank approved by the State Board of Deposits, and after collections have cleared through said bank, the same, except any bond deposits and amount of refunds made, shall be transferred to the State Treasurer who shall place two (2) percent of said money so received in the general fund and the remainder in a special fund of the State Board of Barber Examiners, and the State Treasurer shall pay out of said special fund on warrants drawn by the Auditor of the State, upon vouchers issued and signed by the president and the secretary-treasurer of said Board. The money so received and placed in said fund may be used by the members of the Board in defraying their actual expenses and per diem allowance as hereinafter provided in carrying out the provisions of this Act. Such secretary-treasurer shall keep an accurate and true account of all funds received and all vouchers issued by the Board, and on the first day of December of each year he shall file with the Governor of the State a report of all receipts and disbursements and the activities of said Board for the fiscal year.

Section 2. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 1957.

THE STATE OF WYOMING  
THIRTY-FOURTH STATE LEGISLATURE

AN ACT to amend and re-enact Section 37-411, Wyoming Compiled Statutes, 1945, providing for the payment and disposition of fees for licensing, for the State Board of Barren Examiners, and regarding bonds of the secretary-treasurer and members; and to provide an effective date of this Act.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

I hereby certify that this Act originated in the House.

Section 1. That Section 37-411, Wyoming Compiled Statutes, 1945, be amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

37-411. The board shall elect a president, vice president and a secretary-treasurer of the board.

All fees received by the board shall be payable to the State Board of Equalization and shall be deposited by the board in a bank approved by the State Board of Equalization, and after deposit the same shall be through said bank, the same, except any bond deposits and amount of returns and, shall be transferred to the State Treasurer who shall place two (2) percent of said money so received in the reserve fund and the remainder in a special fund of the State Board of Barren Examiners, and the State Board of Barren Examiners shall pay out of said special fund on warrants drawn by the Auditor of the State, upon vouchers issued and signed by the president and the secretary-treasurer of said board. The money so received and placed in said fund may be used by the members of the board in defraying their actual expenses and per diem allowance as hereinafter provided in carrying out the provisions of this Act. Such secretary-treasurer shall keep an accurate and true record of all funds received and all vouchers issued by the board, and on the first day of December of each year he shall file with the Governor of the State a report of all receipts and disbursements and the activities of said board for the fiscal year.

Section 2. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 1947.
