SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

A JOINT RESOLUTION proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Wyoming by amending Section 32, Article III of the Constitution as it appears in Wyoming Compiled Statutes, 1945, relating to the terms and salaries of public officers.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING, two-thirds of all the members of each of its two Houses, voting separately, concurring therein:

That the following amendment to the Constitution of the State of Wyoming be, and the same hereby is, proposed for submission to the electors of the State of Wyoming, at the next general election to be held in said State, for approval or rejection, to become valid as a part of said Constitution if ratified by a majority of said electors, such amendment being that Section 32, Article III of said Constitution be amended to read and provide as follows:

ARTICLE III, Section 32. Except as otherwise provided in this constitution, no law shall extend the term of any public officer after his election or appointment.

The following statement shall be indorsed on the foregoing proposed amendment by the Secretary of State of Wyoming:

This proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Wyoming permits the Legislature to increase or decrease the salaries of public officials elected by the people during the terms of office of such public officials.
