CHAPTER 18.

CODE OF CIVIL PROCEDURE--AMENDMENT.

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An Act to establish a code of civil procedure for the Territory of Wyoming.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Wyoming:

Section 1. That section 175 of title VIII. of chapter 13, as the same appears on page 54 of the "Compiled

Laws of Wyoming" be and the same is hereby amended by adding to said section at the end thereof, the following to wit: Provided, That if the defendant, his or her agent or attorney shall, within twenty-four hours Property havafter the taking of the property, make an affidavit in ing special writing that the property so taken is a family relic, or ant to make keepsake, or present from a friend, or of special value give undertaking to defendant aside from its ordinary market value, set-taking. ting forth the facts touching the same, and shall also execute an undertaking with one or more sufficient sureties of the defendant, in double the amount of the appraised value of such property, conditioned that defendant will if so adjudged by the Court, deliver up said property according to the final order of the Court, and will pay all costs and damage that may be adjudged against such defendant and deliver such undertaking, together with the affidavit aforesaid to the Sheriff then, and in such case the Sheriff shall deliver such property to the defendant, from whom it was taken, and return the affidavit and undertaking so taken with order of replevin and in such case the plaintiff may except to the sufficiency of the sureties in like manner as provided in section 178 Plaintiff may of this act, and like proceeding thereupon shall be had ties. with the same liabilities and duties to the Sheriff.

SEC. 2. That all laws and parts of laws so far as they Repealare in conflict with this act, be and the same are hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. That this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
