- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 35-25-101 through 35-25-114 are

- 12 VOLUNTEER EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN PENSION FUND

14 35-25-101. Definitions.

15

16 (a) As used in this act:

17

1	(i) "Board" means the volunteer emergency medical
2	technician (EMT) pension board established by this act;
3	
4	(ii) "Children" means all natural children and
5	adoptive children of the participating member, born or
6	conceived at the time of his death or retirement;
7	
8	(iii) "Emergency medical technician" or "EMT"
9	means as defined by W.S. 33-36-102(a)(x) who devotes less
10	than his entire time of employment to serving as a volunteer
11	EMT;
12	
13	(iv) "Entry age" means the earliest date from
14	which contributions have been regularly received by the fund
15	for the member;
16	
17	(v) "Participating member" means any volunteer
18	EMT for whom payments are received by the volunteer EMT
19	pension fund as prescribed in W.S. 35-25-107(e);
20	
21	(vi) "Spouse" means the lawful spouse of a
22	participating member who was married to the volunteer EMT at
23	the time of the volunteer EMT's entry into the fund, or who
24	although married after the date of entry, is recognized as

- 1 the spouse covered by the benefits of the fund as a result
- 2 of special action of the board;

- 4 (vii) "The fund" shall mean the volunteer EMT
- 5 pension account within the trust and agency fund established
- 6 by W.S. 35-25-102;

- 8 (viii) "This act" means W.S. 35-25-101 through
- 9 35-25-114.

- 11 35-25-102. Fund account created; administration;
- 12 disbursements from account.

13

- 14 There is hereby established a volunteer emergency medical
- 15 technician pension account within the trust and agency fund
- 16 from which the awards, benefits, and pensions established
- 17 under the provisions of this act shall be paid. The funds
- 18 shall be controlled by the Wyoming volunteer EMT pension
- 19 board and administered by the director of the Wyoming
- 20 retirement system. All expenses of administration shall be
- 21 paid by the fund. Disbursements from the fund shall be made
- 22 only on duly authorized vouchers signed by the director of
- 23 the retirement account within the trust and agency fund in
- 24 his capacity as chairman of the board and any member of the
- 25 board, and presented to the state auditor for payment.

2 35-25-103. Biennial audit; state's liability.

3

- 4 The director of the state department of audit or his
- 5 designee shall make a biennial audit of the volunteer EMT
- 6 pension fund account and report findings to the volunteer
- 7 EMT board and to the governor. The funds shall be
- 8 administered without liability on the part of the state
- 9 beyond the amount of the funds.

- 35-25-104. Authority to receive donations; investment
- 12 of monies; employment of actuary; actuarial reports.

- 14 In addition to contributions from the state, the board may
- 15 receive and credit to the fund any and all gifts, donations,
- 16 contributions as may be made by individuals, organizations
- 17 and cities, towns and counties for the benefit of the fund.
- 18 The board is hereby authorized and empowered to invest
- 19 monies not immediately necessary to disbursement in
- 20 investments authorized under W.S. 9-3-408(b). The board
- 21 shall employ the services of a consulting actuary to review
- 22 the fund at least once every four (4) years to determine its
- 23 solvency, and to make recommendations as to revisions and
- 24 modifications of the plan. The board also may employ legal
- 25 and other consultants as needed. Actuarial reports are

4 35-25-105. Contributions by volunteer EMTs;

5 collection.

7 Participating volunteer EMTs shall pay to the fund the

8 amount required under W.S. 35-25-107(e). Payments shall be

9 collected upon terms and conditions established by the board

10 under W.S. 35-25-107(e), and shall be forwarded by each

11 collecting officer to the state retirement director for

12 deposit in the fund. No member of the volunteer firemen's

13 pension fund shall be eligible for membership in the fund

14 created by this act.

16 35-25-106. Contributions by cities, towns or counties.

18 In addition to any other amounts appropriated to the fund,

19 each city, town, or county utilizing volunteer EMTs may upon

20 a resolution passed by its governing body pay all or a

21 portion of the contribution to be paid by the volunteer EMTs

22 for the fund, or may match the contributions to be paid to

23 the fund by the volunteer EMTs in order to reduce the

24 expense to the individual volunteer EMTs. The contribution

25 by the local governing bodies shall be entirely voluntary

- 1 and may be entered into at the discretion of the local
- 2 governing bodies as an incentive to improve their emergency
- 3 medical services.

- 5 35-25-107. Benefits enumerated; death of participant
- 6 or spouse; amount and payment of contributions; withdrawal
- 7 from plan.

- 9 (a) Retirement. Whenever any participating member
- 10 shall attain the retirement age corresponding to his entry
- 11 age as set forth in the table contained in subsection (d)
- 12 hereof, the board shall authorize the payment monthly to the
- 13 member during his remaining lifetime of an amount equal to
- 14 the member's pension benefit corresponding to his entry age
- 15 as set forth in such table.

16

- 17 (b) Death. Whenever any participating member shall
- 18 die, the board shall authorize payment monthly to the
- 19 surviving spouse of the member during the spouse's remaining
- 20 lifetime of an amount equal to the surviving spouse's
- 21 benefit corresponding to the entry age of the member as set
- 22 forth in the table in subsection (d) hereof.

- 24 (c) Surviving children. Whenever the last survivor
- 25 of any participating member and his spouse shall die, with

1 children who have not then attained the age of twenty-one

2 (21) years them surviving, the board shall authorize the

3 payment monthly to the lawful guardian of each child of an

4 amount equal to the children's benefit corresponding to the

5 entry age of the member as set forth in the table in

6 subsection (d) hereof.

8 (d) The following table sets forth the member's 9 pension benefit, surviving spouse's benefit and children's 10 benefit for all entry ages. The amounts set forth in this 11 table are applicable to members participating on a twelve 12 dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50) per month contribution

22 (e) A volunteer EMT shall become a participating member in the pension plan under this section for each month 23 there is contributed by or on behalf of the member an amount 24 of twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50) per month. For 25

the purpose of eligibility for benefits under subsections 1 (b), (c) and (g) of this section, a volunteer EMT shall 2 become a participating member beginning with the first month 3 following the month in which the required monthly payment 4 5 and any required application for participation is actually received by the Wyoming retirement system at its office in 6 Cheyenne. For the purpose of continuing as a participating 7 member, subsequent monthly payments must be received by the 8 Wyoming retirement system at its offices in Cheyenne no 9 10 later than three (3) months following the close of the calendar month for which they are applicable. With the 11 consent of and upon any terms and conditions established by 12 13 the board, payments may be accepted at an earlier or later 14 date. The board shall maintain full and complete records of the contributions made on behalf of each participating 15 16 member and on request shall furnish any participating member a statement showing the amounts of contributions and the 17 18 dates for which contributions were received. On the death or 19 retirement of any participating member, his entry age shall 20 be determined by the board to be the earliest date from which contributions have been continuously received by the 21 board for the member. If contributions have varied in 22 amount, the board may make appropriate adjustments in the 23 24 benefits awarded. In making any adjustment, the board shall 25 guided by sound actuarial practice in order that

- 1 substantial equity may be afforded to members of the plan.
- 2 No penalty shall result from the transfer of a participating
- 3 member transferring employment in Wyoming, so long as
- 4 payments are kept current.

- 6 (f) Withdrawal from plan. A participating member may
- 7 withdraw from the plan and in that event he shall be paid an
- 8 amount equal to the amount contributed into his account
- 9 together with interest thereon at the rate of three percent
- 10 (3%) per annum compounded annually.

11

- 12 (g) Upon the death of any member of this retirement
- 13 plan, a death benefit shall be paid in the following manner
- 14 and amount:

15

- 16 (i) A lump-sum payment of five thousand dollars
- 17 (\$5,000.00) to the estate of a deceased member who is
- 18 survived by no person eligible for a benefit under
- 19 subsection (b) or (c) of this section;

- 21 (ii) If the deceased member is survived by a
- 22 spouse who is eligible to receive a benefit under subsection
- 23 (b) of this section, an amount equal to five thousand
- 24 dollars (\$5,000.00) less the total amount of benefits
- 25 received under subsection (b) of this section shall be paid

- 1 to the estate of the spouse at the death of the spouse
- 2 unless the spouse is survived by a person eligible to
- 3 receive a benefit under subsection (c) of this section;

- 5 (iii) If a deceased member or that member's
- 6 spouse is survived by a person or persons eligible for the
- 7 benefit provided by subsection (c) of this section, an
- 8 amount equal to five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) less the
- 9 total amount of benefits received under subsections (b) and
- 10 (c) of this section by all beneficiaries shall be paid in
- 11 equal shares to each of the children alive on the date on
- 12 which the youngest reaches age twenty-one (21).

13

- 14 (h) Retired recipients of the fund and their survivors
- 15 shall receive any benefit increases provided in subsection
- 16 (d) of this section.

17

- 18 (j) The board shall authorize benefit payments from
- 19 the fund in accordance with qualified domestic relations
- 20 orders pursuant to W.S. 9-3-426.

21

- 22 35-25-108. Death benefits in addition to other
- 23 benefits.

- 1 All death benefits received under this act shall be in
- 2 addition to and will be payable after the application of
- 3 workmen's compensation benefits which are payable to
- 4 volunteer EMTs under other provisions of Wyoming law.

- 6 35-25-109. Board; established; nomination;
- 7 appointment; terms and qualification of members.

8

- 9 There is established a volunteer EMT pension board to
- 10 administer the volunteer EMT pension account. The board
- 11 shall consist of six (6) members who shall be appointed by
- 12 the governor for staggered terms of three (3) years. The
- 13 nominees shall be volunteer EMTs who have a minimum of five
- 14 (5) years service as volunteer EMTs in the state of Wyoming.
- 15 The governor may remove any board member as provided in W.S.
- 16 9-1-202.

17

- 18 35-25-110. Board; chairman; compensation of members;
- 19 powers and duties.

- 21 (a) The director of the Wyoming retirement system
- 22 shall act as an ex officio chairman of the board and shall
- 23 have a vote. Members of the board shall serve without
- 24 compensation, but actual and reasonable expenses of the
- 25 members in attending meetings and in representing the board

- 1 shall be reimbursed from the fund. The volunteer EMT pension
- 2 board shall have full authority to adjust claims made by
- 3 EMTs and to waive or alter specific requirements relating to
- 4 benefits under this pension program, but under no
- 5 circumstances may it make a general increase in benefits.
- 6 The board shall have the power to make rules and regulations
- 7 governing its operation. It shall have the power to
- 8 investigate claim applications and to conduct hearings and
- 9 receive evidence, and to act in quasi-judicial capacity.

- 11 (b) The board shall also have specific authority in
- 12 special cases to permit individual participating members to
- 13 retire from active service with their departments while
- 14 continuing monthly pension payments until they reach the
- 15 pension plan retirement age.

16

- 17 (c) The board shall have authority to permit the
- 18 suspension of payments in individual deserving cases with a
- 19 commensurate reduction in benefits paid under the plan.

20

21 **35-25-111.** Board; hearings.

- 23 The board shall procure a written transcript of all
- 24 testimony at all hearings and shall permit persons
- 25 petitioning the board for action to appear before it with or

- 1 without counsel and with witnesses and shall provide
- 2 petitioners the power to subpoena witnesses to testify in
- 3 their behalf. The taking of evidence shall be summary,
- 4 giving a full opportunity to all parties to develop the
- 5 facts fully.

7 35-25-112. Board; appeals.

8

- 9 The decision of the board upon hearing is a final
- 10 administrative decision and is subject to judicial review in
- 11 accordance with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act.

12

13 35-25-113. Insurance on members.

14

- 15 The board shall have authority to purchase private insurance
- 16 on any of the members covered by the fund when in its
- 17 discretion it deems it to the best interest of the fund to
- 18 do so.

19

- 20 35-25-114. Adjustment of benefits in case of
- 21 impairment of funds.

- 23 If at any time in the future the net assets of the fund
- 24 become actuarially impaired, the board may adjust the
- 25 benefits provided pro rata until such impairment is removed.

Section 2. There is appropriated to the volunteer EMT pension fund created by W.S. 35-25-102 from the general fund the amount of four hundred eighty-nine thousand one hundred dollars (\$489,100.00) for the purposes of this act. Any amounts appropriated from the state for the pension shall be repaid at such time and in such manner as determined by the board so as to keep the pension fund actuarially sound.

Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 1998.
