A BILL

for

1 AN ACT to create W.S. 33-214.1; and to repeal W.S. 33-214
2 relating to embalmers; decreasing license fees; providing
3 qualifications for licensure; deleting provision for reci-
4 procity; and providing for an effective date.

5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

6 Section 1. W.S. 33-214.1 is created to read:

7 33-214.1. Embalmers; application for license; fee;
8 examination; qualifications; registration and display of
9 license; license not transferable.

10 (a) Every person desiring to engage in the practice
11 of embalming dead human bodies within Wyoming shall make a
12 written application for a license to the state board of
13 embalmers on forms furnished by the board and pay a li-
14 cense fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). All applicants
15 for a license shall be over the age of twenty-one (21)
16 years.

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1 (b) The applicant shall appear before the board and
2 shall be examined on the subjects of the principles and
3 methods of embalming, public health and sanitation, anat-
4 omy, disinfection, pathology, chemistry, physiology, bac-
5 teriology, laws and rules regulating the transportation of
6 dead human bodies, funeral management and any other
7 subject related to the embalming and funeral field. The
8 applicant shall also take an oral examination which may be
9 conducted in the presence of a cadaver upon which actual
10 demonstration may be required. All examination papers
11 shall be kept on file by the board of embalmers.

12 (c) The board of embalmers shall issue a license to
13 the applicant to practice the profession of embalming in
14 the state of Wyoming if the applicant has:

15 (i) Completed a full prescribed course in a
16 duly accredited high school or a course of education
17 equivalent thereto;

18 (ii) Completed two (2) years or sixty (60)
19 semester hours or ninety (90) quarter hours of college
20 credits in an approved and accredited college;

21 (iii) Graduated from a college of mortuary
22 science which is approved by the board and the commission

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1 of schools of the american board of funeral service edu-
2 cation;

3 (iv) Completed two (2) years of actual prac-
4 tical experience, training and instruction as an
5 apprentice under a regularly licensed and practicing
6 embalmer, one (1) year of which was served under a li-
7 censed embalmer in the state of Wyoming; and

8 (v) Passed a creditable examination in accord
9 with the rules and regulations of the board.

10 (d) The state board of embalmers shall select all
11 questions to be used for examining applicants for a li-
12 cense. It will accept the national board examination of
13 the conference of funeral service examining board as the
14 written portion of the Wyoming state board of embalmers'
15 examination.

16 (e) Every person licensed under W.S. 33-214.1
17 through 33-229 shall register the license at the health
18 office of the city and county where the licensee proposes
19 to carry on the profession of embalming and shall display
20 the license in a conspicuous place in the office of the
21 licensee. Licenses are not assignable and do not grant
22 authority to any person other than the holder to practice
23 the profession of embalming.

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1 Section 2. W.S. 33-214 is repealed.

2 Section 3. This act is effective May 27, 1977.
