

The cost to the state will be an additional \$18,000,000 authorization for the Farm Loan Board to lend to School Districts for emergency construction. Adequate funds are available within the Common School Permanent Land Fund to meet this loan amount, and the permanent funds would not be decreased since loans would be made. It is assumed the Land Board would deplete the \$18,000,000 in 3 to 4 years; loans would average 20 years maturity and interest rates would be 5 to 5-1/2 per cent.
