Original House Bill No. 63

ARBOR DAY ACTIVITIES

AN ACT to repeal and recreate W.S. 8-52 relating to Arbor day activities; providing for commemorative activities in schools and on state grounds; setting a date for observation; and providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

Section 1. W.S. 8-52 is repealed and recreated to read:

8-52. Arbor day.

(a) The state forester shall promote the following activities to commemorate Arbor day, the last Monday in April:

(i) A tree shall be planted on state grounds in a simple ceremony;

(ii) The planting of a seedling tree or some other act may be performed in an appropriate ceremony in the schools of Wyoming.

(b) Arbor day shall be a public holiday. This section, however, shall not be construed to affect commercial paper, the making or execution of agreements in writing or judicial proceedings, or to authorize schools, businesses or public offices to close.

Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon passage.
