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Introduction

The same systematic coverage of all legislative action on each File, Bill, Memorial and Resolution is followed in this summary as in the first two digests prepared for the 34th and 35th Legislatures. You will find however, much more information in this volume because all amendments submitted are made a part of this report. If the amendment submitted was rejected, it is placed at the end of the report on each bill. The rejected or "failed" amendments are shown primarily to give further evidence of the intent of the legislature. They show *what was not wanted*. It is hoped that this extra information will be useful to all who seek the true couse of the law.

At the request of the members all roll calls of final action on each bill are shown in their entirety. In the case of unanimous vote, however, the names are not shown.

On all bills becoming law, the Chapter Number, Session Laws of Wyoming 1961 is shown. In the Appendix several indexes are shown. There are rosters of members, committees, appointments, a table showing the laws that are effective at any date other than the 90 day statutory time and an alphabetical listing of bills introduced by short subject titles.

FIRST DAY — NOON SESSION

Senate Chamber

Cheyenne, Wyoming, January 10, 1961

The hour of twelve o'clock noon of the second Tuesday in January having arrived, this being the hour designated by the Constitution of the State of Wyoming for the convening of the Thirty-sixth Legislature, Honorable Charles Irwin, President Ad Interim of the Senate, asked the Senators-elect to be in order and invited the Reverend Dr. Fred Clark to invoke the Divine blessing.

Senator Greene moved that Frances D. Clark be appointed Temporary Chief Clerk of the Senate. The motion carried. Thereupon, Mr. President instructed the Temporary Chief Clerk to call the roll, and the following Senators responded to their names.

The Committee on Credentials being ready to report, the President called the Senate to order.

Senator Foote moved the report of the Committee on Credentials be adopted and the Committee discharged. The motion carried.

Senator Barlow moved that the Chair appoint a committee of two to wait upon the Honorable Chief Justice Blume and request his presence in the Senate Chamber to administer the oath of office to the Senators-elect. The motion carried and Mr. President appointed Senators Christensen and Kinnaman.

The President then declared a short recess to await the arrival of the Chief Justice, subject to the call of the Chair. Mr. President then called the Senate to order to receive the committee with the Chief Justice.

The Sergeant at Arms announced the presence of Chief Justice Blume, whereupon the Chief Justice administered the oath of office to the Senators-elect.

Senator Jones moved that the Senate proceed to the nomination of permanent officers. The motion carried.

OFFICERS OF THE SENATE

Senator Irwin declared the election of the permanent officers of the Senate to be the next order of business.

Senator Johnston placed in nomination for the office of President of the Senate the name of Senator Albert C. Harding of Crook County, Wyoming.

Senator Anselmi seconded the nomination of Senator Harding and moved that his election be made unanimous, dispensing with the roll call. Motion carried.

Mr. President Ad Interim thereupon declared that by unanimous vote of the Senate, Senator Harding was elected as its President.

Senator McMaster moved that a committee of two be appointed to escort the President-elect to the Chair. The motion carried, and the President Ad Interim appointed Senators Walters and Robinson.

Chief Justice Blume thereupon administered the oath to the President.

The President, upon taking his chair, addressed the Senate as follows:

"Chief Justice Blume, Members of the Senate, ladies and gentlemen: It is with mixed emotions that I accept and thank you for this office. There is, I believe, a sense of humility and inadequateness which seems to come to all of us, at one time or another, in these chambers, especially when we contemplate the history of this great state, the great men who have preceded us at these very desks.

There is a sense of responsibility; my increased responsibility to you and to all the people of Wyoming.

There is a sense of urgency; the short time available to us and the many problems which we must and will consider.

And there is also, perhaps neither last nor least, a sense of dedicacation to serve you just as fairly and as completely as I possibly can.

Therefore, I pledge to each of you that I will do my utmost to serve _ the purposes of this Senate impartially.

Thank you."

Mr. President then informed the Senate that motions would be in order for nomination for Vice-President.

Senator Bower placed in nomination the name of David Foote, Sr. for Vice-President.

Senator Murphy seconded the nomination of Senator Foote and moved that the election of Senator Foote be made unanimous, dispensing with the roll call. The motion carried.

The President declared that Senator Foote had been unanimously elected Vice-President of the Senate.

Senator Madsen moved that a committee of two be appointed to escort Vice-President-elect Foote to the rostrum. The motion carried and the President appointed Senators Yoder and Bridgmon.

The Honorable Chief Justice Blume administered the oath, after which Mr. President presented the Honorable David Foote, Sr. to the Senate. The Vice-President addressed the Senate as follows:

"Mr. President, my colleagues in the Senate, and ladies and gentlemen: I have no speech prepared, but if I did it would be short. I hope I do not have many decisions to make, but if I do they will be fair and impartial. This is a great honor and I will do my best to justify it in a fair and sensible manner. Thank you very much."

Mr. President then introduced the majority floor leader, Senator Charles Irwin, who addressed the Senate as follows:

"Mr. President: I am deeply appreciative of the honor you have conferred upon me. I will try to justify your faith in me. I will be glad to cooperate with each member of the Senate in a fair manner. I thank you."

Mr. President then introduced the minority floor leader, Senator Rudolph Anselmi, who addressed the Senate as follows.

"Mr. President and fellow members of the Senate: I am happy to be back again and pledge to each and every one of you my cooperation and the cooperation of the minority, and if there is any criticism it will be constructive criticism, and our job here will be for the betterment of the State of Wyoming."

Mr. President then asked Senators Anselmi, Foote, Bower, Greene and Kinnaman to stand. Mr. President said that the average experience

of all members of the Senate was nine years, but that there were over 100 years of legislative experience accumulated by these five men.

Senate President Harding asked the committee to escort His Excellency, Jack R. Gage, back to his office.

Senator Irwin moved that the Joint Session be dissolved. The motion prevailed and it was so ordered.

LINCOLN DAY SPEECH

by Senator James Brunk

February 12th, 1961

Mr. President, colleagues: I owe a debt of thanks to you, Mr. President for providing the impetus for me to speak; to rekindle my brief, vicarious acquaintance with Mr. Abe Lincoln.

I have a reason for calling him "Mr." I'm sure you have all heard many, many talks about President Lincoln, and many talks on the youth and early days of Lincoln. So, with your kind permission, I should like to deal with that time of his life that is least well-known his first few years in politics—the time between 1832 when he first decided to join the political race, and 1860 when he was elected President.

That period of 28 years produced in Lincoln's life the foundation on which he was able to build. His early work in the State of Illinois legislature provided him with experience, and it pointed the way to the political career which would serve as the vehicle for his greatness.

In the form of a narrative then, I would like to touch upon just a few of the political milestones of those years. With the time I have, I'm going to have to hurry.

It was early 1832 that Lincoln first turned to politics in the town of New Salem. He was running for the House of the State Legislature. The young surveyor's platform was internal improvements, better educational facilities, and a law to limit interest rates—does that sound familiar to any of you?

His campaigning was interrupted by an Indian uprising—the Black Hawk affair. It lasted 80 days and when he arrived home there were only 2 weeks until election. He had little chance to travel and make speeches. On one occasion a fight developed in the crowd. Lincoln stopped his speech, strode through the crowd, grabbed the assailant by the neck and seat of the trousers and tossed him several feet. He then strode back and finished his speech. He won that precinct, his home one, quite handily, 277 out of 300 votes. However, he didn't fare so well in the rest—he lost the election. He remembered it as the only time he was ever defeated in a direct vote of the people.

In the spring of 1834, he tried again as a bipartisan, and issued no declaration of principles and made few speeches, but he did campaign quietly. A friend mentions that Lincoln came to his house at harvest time when some 30 men were working in the fields, and after eating his dinner went out and won their unanimous vote by surpassing them all at cradling wheat. He won this election.

At this point in his career he turned to the study of law as his political win had given him confidence. He was described by a friend like this—"He was the most uncouth-looking young man I ever saw. He seemed to have but little to say. He seemed to feel timid with a tinge of sadness visible in the countenance, but when he did talk all this disappeared for the time and he demonstrated that he was both strong and acute. He surprised us more and more at every visit."

At this session of the legislature there is described a scene that is worth repeating. With the opening of the legislative session the State Capitol was only ten years old, but already in such disrepair that flights of frontier eloquence were sometimes interrupted by the crash of falling plaster. Members sat in movable chairs at long tables, each

accommodating three men. The Speaker on a small platform, also sat behind a table. On each table stood a cork inkstand. Sandboxes distributed about the room not only furnished sand for blotting, but also served as cuspidors. A fireplace and a stove provided warmth. Over the water pail hung three tin dippers. Candles in tall holders shed dim lights on evening sessions. Notwithstanding this unpretentious background the scene became impressive when members congregated in the chamber with 55 representatives and 26 senators.

In 1836 Lincoln received his license to practice law and was again elected to the legislature. It was during this session the feeling on slavery first raised its head. A joint committee of the House and Senate recommended the adoption of a series of resolutions condemning abolitionists, declaring the Constitution sanctified the right of property in slaves. Lincoln moved to add "Unless the people of the said District petition for the same." His amendment failed. He couldn't push because of internal improvement projects and for the moment he kept silent. After his legislative program was safely enacted into law he spread upon the journal his feelings on this issue of slavery. He declared he believed the institution of slavery to be founded on both injustice and bad policy. He deplored the promulgation of abolition doctrines as calculated to increase rather than abate the evils of slavery. Congress had no power under the Constitution to interfere with slavery in the States, but did have power to abolish slavery in the District of Columbia, though it should not do so except at the request of the people of the District.

After the session in 1837 he moved with the capitol to Springfield and a big change in his life was noted. His self-reliance was unspoiled by boastfulness. He held no contempt for foreign lands and foreign people. His robust jocularity remained untamed, and his early impulsiveness was giving way to calm analysis. He realized the value of the law of the land. One profound student thought this: "He early came to think he was odd, that being odd, he must learn to stand alone, and that standing alone would make him strong."

In 1838 Lincoln stood as a candidate for a third term and won, but lost the bid for speaker.

In 1840 he was in the legislature for the 4th time. He was again defeated for speaker, much to his dismay. He learned the ways and nature of politics—appeal, persuasion, compromise, maneuver—became thoroughly familiar to him.

Early in 1843 he began the race for bigger offices. He wrote to a friend, "Now if you should hear anyone say that Lincoln does not want to go to Congress, I wish you as a personal friend of mine, would tell him

that you have reason to believe he is mistaken." The greatest concentration of Whig strength was in Lincoln's own 7th Congressional district and this brought formidable opponents such as John Hardin and Edward Baker, both outstanding young men. Lincoln's first move was to get Sangamon County delegates pledged to him. He failed, and to make matters worse, he was selected as a delegate pledged to Baker. It moved him to write to a friend, "I shall be fixed a good deal like a fellow who is made groomsman to the man that has cut him out and is marrying his own dear gal."

Hardin had the support of the convention and won the nomination, but Lincoln introduced a principle of rotation in office whereby Baker would succeed Hardin after one term, and Lincoln would succeed Baker. It worked out that way and Lincoln won the nomination in 1846 by acclamation.

Lincoln was diligent in the rountine work of the House. He rarely missed a roll call and performed his full share of labor on his two Committees; the Post Office and District roads and the Committee of Expenditures in the War Department. Few first term members have been more active, yet his colleagues generally appraised him as a droll Westerner of average talents.

Under the rules of turn about is fair play Lincoln did not run again for Congress but turned his talents to mere interest in politics. When his term was up Lincoln had no choice but to return to the practice of law. He felt he had no future in politics but he did not repine. He began at once to make himself a better lawyer and a more enlightened man. This decision made the years of his political retirement from 1849-1954 among the most fruitful of his life for as he put aside all thought of political advancement he devoted himself to personal improvement and grew termendously in mind and character.

In 1854 he again ran and won a legislative seat but resigned in order to be eligible for the U.S. Senate race. Again he was not defeated by the people but was unable to win the nomination in his own party. After the loss he described the situation like this: "Just now I fear to do anything lest I do wrong." He did not, however, turn his back on politics again but watched for his time.

It came in 1858; he had the inside track on the nomination for Senator, who in those days were elected by State legislatures and nominated in Legislative party caucuses. He won the nomination quite easily, but was to run an unsuccessful campaign against a man by the name of Stephen Douglas.

Again Lincoln lost the legislative vote 46 to 54 and Douglas won the seat in the Senate. But during the battle between Douglas and Lincoln the first of the great debates were heard and through them Lincoln became a national figure winning the Presidential crown in 1860.

Summarizing the 28 years then one sees one loss in Lincoln's first attempt in 1822 by a vote of the people; five successful elections to the Legislature; one loss for the Senate nomination by party vote; one successful Senate nomination which resulted in a loss for the Senate seat; and lastly a successful Presidential candidate in 1860.

EVENING SESSION

The Senate re-convened at 8:30 p.m., Mr. President in the Chair.

ELECTION OF PRESIDENT AD INTERIM

Senator Irwin moved that the Senate do now proceed with nomination of President Ad Interim. The motion prevailed and Senator Greene placed in nomination the name of Senator Richard Jones of Park County. Senator Greene's motion was seconded by Senator Anselmi of Sweetwater County.

Thereupon, President Harding declared that the Senate had by its vote, elected Senator Richard Jones of Park County, as President Ad Interim.

Senator Irwin moved that a committee of two be appointed to wait upon the Chief Justice Blume and escort him to the Chambers to administer the oath of office to President Ad Interim elect Jones. The motion prevailed and Mr. President appointed Senators Walters and Murphy as said Committee.

Senator Irwin moved that a committee of two be appointed to escort the newly elected President Ad Interim to the rostrum. The motion prevailed and Mr. President appointed Senators Christensen and Meyers to escort Senator Jones to the rostrum.

Chief Justice Blume then administered the oath of office to Senator Jones who addressed the members of the Senate as follows: "Mr. President, ladies and fellow senators: I am at a loss for words, but I am greatly honored. I don't know exactly what are the duties of the President Ad Interim, but I will do my best to carry them out."

SENATE ADJOURNMENT PROCEEDINGS

Senator Irwin moved that a Committee of two be appointed to inform the House that the Senate has concluded its labors and is ready to adjourn sine die. The motion prevailed and Mr. President appointed Senators Madsen and Yoder to act as said Committee.

Senator Irwin moved that a Committee of two be appointed to escort His Excellency, Jack R. Gage, Governor of Wyoming, to the Senate Chamber. The motion prevailed and Mr. President appointed Senators Robinson and Johnston to act as said Committee. Governor Gage then addressed the members of the Senate briefly.

President Harding thanked the Governor for coming to address the Senate.

Mr. President announced that Committee No. 17, having examined the Journal of February 18th, recommends that it be approved. There being no objection, Mr. President announced that the Journal was approved.

The closing prayer was offered by the Senate Chaplain, the Reverend Dr. Fred C. Clark.

Senator Irwin moved that the Senate adjourn sine die. The motion prevailed and President Harding declared that the Senate of the Thirtysixth Legislature of Wyoming had adjourned sine die.
