Section 1. That the following amendment to Section 10 11 1, Article 20 of the Constitution of the State of Wyoming 12 is proposed for verbatim submission to the electors of the state of Wyoming at the next general election to be 13 held in the state, for approval or rejection, to become 14 valid as a part of said Constitution if ratified by a 15 majority of such electors. The amendment is as follows: 16 17 (a) Any amendment or amendments to this Constitution

may be proposed in either branch of the legislature, and,

if the same shall be agreed to by two-thirds of all the

members of each of the two houses, voting separately,
