A BILL

FOR AN ACT

WYONG TO THE UNITED STATES OF AMER-

ICA AND TO CEDE JURISDICTION

THEREOR.

BE IT ENACTED By the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
Section I. That there is hereby ceded to the United States of America the following described lands belonging to the State of Wyoming, and situated in Sheridan County, to wit: 1 Commencing at a point Four Hundred Twenty-eight (428) feet South of the one-half (1/2) Section corner between Sections Ten (10) and Fifteen (15) in Township Fifty-three(53) North of Range Eighty-three (83) West of Sixth P.M.; thence East Three Hundred and Thirty (330) feet; thence South One Hundred (100) feet; thence West Three Hundred and Thirty (330) feet, thence North One Hundred (100) feet to place of beginning; Containing Three-fourths (3/4) of One (1) acre, more or less; the same to be used as a site for the erection of a monument to the memory of the soldiefs who fought in the Fort Phil Kearney massacre.

Section II. That exclusive jurisdiction be, and the same is hereby, ceded to the United States of America over and within the aforesaid territory, saving, however, to this State the right to serve civil and criminal processes within said territory in suits for, and on account of, rights acquired, obligations incurred, or crimes committed in said State but outside of said cession.
