A BILL

for

1 AN ACT to amend Chapter 63, Section 23, 1980 Wyoming
 2 Session Laws relating to medical assistance services
 3 appropriations under the department of health and social
 4 services; supplementing the appropriation from the general
 5 fund and federal funds to increase the minimum subsistence
 6 monthly allowance under Title XIX from \$25 to \$40 for
 7 medicaid recipients who are residents of nursing homes;
 8 specifying appropriation use; and providing for an effec-
 9 tive date.

6 1. Of the appropriation, \$30,000 shall be used to conduct
7 arthritis education outreach programs in Wyoming
8 communities.

9 2. Of the appropriation, \$100,000 is available for infant
10 intensive care upon passage of this act.

11 3. Of the appropriation, \$70,000 is available to patients
12 for renal dialysis upon passage of this act.

13 4. No funds appropriated under this act shall be used to
14 pay for abortions except when the pregnancy is the
15 result of incest or when the life of the mother would
16 be endangered if the unborn child was carried to full
17 term.

18 5. The head of the division of social services, with the
19 approval of the director of the department, shall
20 transfer public assistance workers and social services
21 workers from counties with light work loads to counties
22 with heavy work loads.

23 6. Of this appropriation, \$99,523 shall be used to employ
24 three (3) additional Public Health Patient Care Spe-
25 cialist I.

26 7. No state funds are to be expended for the women,
27 infants and children program in the event that funds
28 are reduced or eliminated.

29 8. The agency administering this program shall use its
30 best efforts in implementing this program to determine
31 the numbers of pregnant, postpartum, and breastfeeding
32 women, infants and young children, in this state from
33 families with inadequate income who are at special risk
34 with respect to their physical and mental health by
35 reason of inadequate nutrition or health care, or both,

as those terms are defined in 42 U.S.C. sec. 1786, and it shall determine and evaluate the benefits of the program in Wyoming established under this section and report its findings and conclusions to the next session of the Wyoming state legislature. The agency shall expend only those amounts of this appropriation it deems necessary to meet identifiable needs.

OF THIS APPROPRIATION, \$250,000 SHALL BE USED TO INCREASE THE MINIMUM SUBSISTENCE MONTHLY ALLOWANCE UNDER TITLE XIX FROM \$25 TO \$40 FOR MEDICAID RECIPIENTS WHO ARE RESIDENTS OF NURSING HOMES.

1 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon
2 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
3 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Con-
4 stitution.
