1 AN ACT to amend W.S. 33-44, 33-92(a), (b), (c) and (f),

5 assessed lawyers, barbers, podiatrists, chiropractors,

7 psychologists, engineers and electricians by occupational
8 licensing boards; providing limited board discretion in
9 the determination of fees for certain professions; and
10 providing for an effective date.

11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

12 Section 1. W.S. 33-44, 33-92(a), (b), (c) and (f),
13 33-93, 33-133.5, 33-133.7, 33-139, 33-146, 33-148, 33-160,
14 33-299(c), 33-326.10, 33-326.13(a), 33-343.12(a), 33-361,
15 33-362, 35-436.38(a)(i) and 35-436.40(a) are amended to
16 read:

1 33-44. Same; fees; applicant entitled to two exami-
2 nations; certificate of admission; disposition of fees.

3 Every applicant for admission to the bar of this state
4 shall pay a fee of ~~\$50~~ ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00) at
5 the time of filing the application. On payment of one (1)
6 fee by applicants for admission ~~with~~ BY examination the
7 applicant shall be entitled to two (2) examinations, ~~but~~
8 ~~no more;~~ WHEN the second ~~being~~ IS applied for not later
9 than one (1) year after having taken the first. The pay-
10 ment of the ~~said~~ fee shall also entitle the applicant,
11 upon being admitted, to a certificate of admission. All
12 money shall be received and collected as provided by law.
13 The state treasurer shall place the money to the credit of
14 an account within the earmarked revenue fund.

15 32-92. Fees for examination, certificate and permit.

16 (a) The fee to be paid by an applicant for each
17 examination to determine his fitness to receive a certifi-
18 cate of registration to practice as a registered barber
19 shall be ~~\$25.00~~ NOT MORE THAN FIFTY DOLLARS (\$50.00), and
20 for issuance of the certificate, ~~\$10.00~~ AND LATER RENEWALS
21 NOT MORE THAN TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$25.00). AN APPRENTICE
22 BARBER SHALL RECEIVE CREDIT FOR THE EXAMINATION FEE PAID
23 TO SECURE HIS CURRENT WYOMING APPRENTICE LICENSE AS AN

1 OFFSET AGAINST THE FEE REQUIRED FOR EXAMINATION UNDER THIS
2 SUBSECTION.

3 (b) The fee to be paid by an applicant for each
4 examination to determine his fitness to receive a certifi-
5 cate of registration to practice as an apprentice shall
6 be ~~\$12.50~~ NOT MORE THAN TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$25.00), and
7 for the issuance of the certificate ~~--\$7.00~~ AND LATER
8 RENEWALS NOT MORE THAN FIFTEEN DOLLARS (\$15.00).

9 (c) ~~The fee to be paid for each examination for a~~
10 ~~registered barber license by an applicant who is holding a~~
11 ~~current Wyoming apprentice license shall be twelve dollars~~
12 ~~and fifty cents (\$12.50).~~ ALL FEES SHALL BE DETERMINED BY
13 THE BOARD AND ADOPTED AS PROVIDED BY LAW.

14 (f) The fee to be paid for a TEMPORARY permit to
15 practice as a barber ~~is \$15.00~~, SHALL BE NOT MORE THAN
16 TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$25.00), and the granting of the
17 permit shall entitle him to practice until he is directed
18 to appear for an examination. The fee for a TEMPORARY
19 permit to practice as an apprentice ~~is \$10.00~~, SHALL BE
20 NOT MORE THAN FIFTEEN DOLLARS (\$15.00), and the granting
21 of the permit shall entitle him to practice as an
22 apprentice until he is directed to appear for an exami-
23 nation. In each instance an applicant must have a paid up

1 barber license or a paid up apprentice license from
2 another state, or have graduated from an approved barber
3 school or college within three (3) years of date of making
4 application. Each applicant can only receive one (1)

6 33-93. Annual renewal; reinstatement; fees. ON OR
7 BEFORE JUNE 30 EACH YEAR every registered barber and every
8 registered apprentice who continues in active practice of
9 service shall ~~annually, on or before June 30th of each~~
10 ~~year~~ renew his certificate of registration by paying the
11 required fee. Every certificate of registration which has
12 not been renewed prior to June ~~30th in any year~~ 30 shall
13 expire on the ~~31st day of July in that year~~ 31 THAT YEAR.
14 Any formerly registered barber or any formerly registered
15 apprentice whose certificate of registration has expired
16 may within one (1) year of the date of expiration have

2 33-133.5. Examinations. Examinations of applicants
3 for a license to practice podiatry shall be in the English
4 language and shall include both clinical and written tests
5 as the board shall determine, ~~and~~ THE EXAMINATIONS shall
6 embrace the subjects of histology, surgery, hygiene,
7 dermatology, anatomy, physiology, chemistry, bacteriology,
8 pathology, diagnosis and treatment, pharmacology,
9 therapeutics, clinical podiatry and such other added sub-
10 jects as the board may prescribe, a knowledge of which is
11 commonly and generally required by the practitioners of
12 podiatry. ~~but~~ This section shall not be construed to
13 require of the applicant a medical or surgical education.
14 The minimum requirements for a license to practice under
15 ~~this act~~ W.S. 33-133.1 THROUGH 33-133.13 is a general
16 passing grade average of seventy-five percent (75%) in all
17 of the subjects involved and not less than sixty percent
18 (60%) in any one (1) subject. At the time of making of
19 the application to practice, an examination and license
20 fee of not more than ~~fifty-dollars--(\$50.00)~~ ONE HUNDRED
21 DOLLARS (\$100.00) shall be paid to the board. An appli-
22 cant failing in the examination and being refused a li-
23 cense is entitled, within six (6) months of the refusal,
24 to a ~~reexamination~~ RE-EXAMINATION, but only two (2) such

1 ~~reexaminations~~ RE-EXAMINATIONS shall be granted to any one
2 (1) applicant. The board may make such rules and regula-

4 iners, through the secretary-treasurer thereof, upon such
5 form and in such manner as may be prescribed and directed
6 by the board, at least fifteen (15) days prior to any
7 meeting of the board. Each applicant shall be a graduate
8 of a recognized school of chiropractic, in which he actu-
9 ally attended a course of study for at least four (4)
10 years of nine (9) months each, preceded by a four-year
11 high school course or its equivalent, and at least two (2)
12 years of study in either a course of liberal arts or
13 science at the University of Wyoming or in a college or
14 university accredited by the board, ~~and provided that this~~
15 ~~qualification of liberal arts and science study shall not~~
16 ~~be applicable to any person now attending a recognized~~
17 ~~school of chiropractic.~~ Application shall be in writing
18 and shall be signed by the applicant and sworn to before
19 some officer authorized to administer oaths. There shall
20 be paid by each applicant for a license ~~a fee of fifty~~

22 (\$200.00) which FEE, AS DETERMINED BY THE BOARD, shall

1 restoration. All persons practicing chiropractic within

5 FIFTY DOLLARS (\$50.00). If any practicing chiropractor
6 shall fail to pay the renewal license tax imposed by ~~this~~

8 after the same is due and payable, the board shall revoke


