An Act to Provide against Accidents on Railroads, and

*Limit the Hours of Service; and limiting the age
of certain employees.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming.

Section 1. Any company operating a railroad over thirty miles in length, in whole or in part, within this state, shall not permit or require any conductor, engineer, fire-man, brakeman, agent or telegraph operator employed by any such company, who have worked in their respective capacities for twenty-four consecutive hours, to again be required ^{or allowed} to go on duty or perform any work until they have had at least eight hours rest.

Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful for any railroad or other corporation operating any railroad or telegraph line in this State to employ any one under the age of eighteen years for the purpose of telegraph operator, and he or she shall be known to said company or corporation to be of temperate habits.

Sec. 3. Any company who violates or permits to be violated any of the provisions of the preceding section, or any officer who violates or permits to be violated any of the provisions of the preceding section, shall be fined not less than one hundred dollars nor more than one hundred and fifty dollars.

Sec. 4. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
