III. Practice Updates

Practice and Education Committee has split into two committees.

Helen Byrd is now Chair and Kathy Cromer has joined committee.

APRN focus groups completed and communications are in place. Contact made by JB/CL via telephone with two CNOs and additional CNOs are scheduled each week as schedule allows. Motion requested from the Board for final draft of CNO memo and distribution of documents explaining population focus and APRN roles.

JB spoke at WACPN Summit in Casper and addressed scope of practice/ population foci issues.

Committee is working on LPN scope of practice intervention list.

WNA Summit in Laramie was attended by CL and JB with good networking results and marketing efforts related to eNLC.

No current advisory opinions are being developed but the following were approved this quarter; Emergency Opioid Treatment, Death Certificates, CNA II update. All active AOs were reviewed in July.

WNR September Edition focused on eNLC and had information related to APRN population foci (as did the summer edition). Revisions were made to the format of the WNR removing disciplinary details and adding licensure statistics.

Chapter 3 Scope of Practice and Chapter 9 Delegation Rules were adopted.

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
