Revenue is generated from royalties paid by private entities for commercial use of the Bucking Horse and Rider (BH&R) trademark. Expenditures will be made to protect, preserve and promote the BH&R trademark. Royalties in excess of expenditures will be deposited to the General Fund.

Assumptions:

Amount of revenue is an estimate only and is based on future royalties generated.

In addition, the Secretary of State's Office may incur administrative expenditures up to \$100,000 per year to protect, preserve, and promote the BH&R trademark.
