

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT to amend W.S. 21-349(b) and by creating a new sub-  
2 section (c) relating to required servitude or payout for  
3 medical and dental students; providing for partial payout;  
4 and providing for an effective date.

5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

6 Section 1. W.S. 21-349 is amended by amending sub-  
7 section (b) and by creating a new subsection (c) to read:

8 21-349. Same; qualification of students; authorizing  
9 payment of tuition costs and alternatives.

10 (b) In addition to the requirements of subsection  
11 (a) of this section, before expending any funds the board  
12 of trustees shall obtain an agreement from each student  
13 whereby the student agrees to:

14 (i) Authorize the state of Wyoming to pay all  
15 tuition costs incurred in his or her medical OR DENTAL

1 education as determined by any contract between the state  
2 of Wyoming and the school of medicine OR SCHOOL OF  
3 DENTISTRY providing that education; and

4 (ii) Actively engage in professional practice  
5 or other professional pursuits in Wyoming for ~~a period of~~  
6 time not to exceed LESS THAN three (3) years as the board  
7 requires; ~~the taking of~~ OR

8 (iii) TAKE a family practice residency program  
9 in the state ~~may be substituted~~ in lieu of the practice  
10 requirements; or

11 ~~(iii)~~(iv) Repay all amounts expended by the  
12 state of Wyoming under paragraph (i) OF THIS SUBSECTION on  
13 the student's education upon such terms as specified by  
14 the board.

15 (c) IF THE STUDENT PRACTICES HIS PROFESSION IN  
16 WYOMING, THE MEDICAL OR DENTAL BOARD SHALL CREDIT ONE-  
17 THIRD (1/3) OF THE TUITION EXPENDITURES AS DEFINED IN W.S.  
18 21-439(b)(i), TOGETHER WITH INTEREST, TO THE STUDENT FOR  
19 EACH YEAR OF SUCH PRACTICE AS CERTIFIED BY THE BOARD.

20 Section 2. This act is effective May 27, 1977.
