ENROLLED ACT NO. 87, HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

FORTY-SECOND SESSION OF THE STATE LEGISLATURE OF  
THE STATE OF WYOMING

AN ACT to create section 5-1.2 of the statutes relating to the judicial supervisory commission; providing terms of office for members of the judicial supervisory commission; providing for member's expenses; providing an appropriation; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

Section 1. Section 5-1.2 of the statutes is created to read:

5-1.2. Terms of judicial supervisory commission members; expenses.

(a) The terms of the elected and appointed members of the judicial supervisory commission created by article 5, section 6, Wyoming Constitution, shall be four years except the initial term for one judge, one attorney and one elector shall be two years. The judges and the members of the Wyoming state bar initially elected or appointed to the commission shall draw lots to determine the term each shall serve. The governor shall designate whether the length of the term of electors he initially appoints to the commission shall be for two or four years. The

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terms of all initial elected and appointed members shall begin on March 1, 1973. After serving a full term, no member shall be eligible for reelection or reappointment to the commission, except for district judges who may again be elected to the commission after a six year interim.


(b) The members of the judicial supervisory commission shall not receive any fees, salary or other compensation for services rendered but are entitled to receive per diem and mileage on the same basis and at the same rate as state employees and reimbursement for any other actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of commission duties.

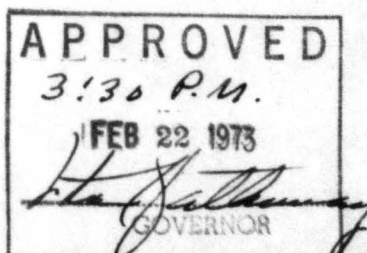
Section 2. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund of the state treasury, the sum of \$10,000 to carry out the purposes of this act.

Section 3. This act shall be in full force and effect after its passage.

(b) The members of the Judicial Appointments Commission shall not receive any fees, salary or other compensation for services rendered but are entitled to receive per diem and mileage on the same basis and at the same rate as state judges and reimbursement for any other actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of commission duties.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund of the state treasury, the sum of \$10,000 to carry out the purposes of this act.

Section 3. This act shall be in full force and effect after its passage.
